

POLICE JURY PROCEEDINGS

Opelousas, La., March 6th, 1916. The Police Jury met in regular session this sixth day of March, 1916, with the following members present:

Mr. F. Dimmick, President, presiding; Messrs. Evans, Dailey, Iseringhausen, Fisetle, Dunbar, W. F. Brown, Catlett, Walters, Beall, McCaffery, Foster, St. Cyr, Guillory and Pavy.

Motion by Mr. McCaffery. Be it resolved that a warrant for the sum of Six Hundred Dollars, (\$600.00), be issued in favor of the Parish Treasurer, against the budget appropriation of 1916, known as the "Election Fund" for the payment of commissioners and clerks of election and also the expenses of sending out ballot boxes and election supplies for the election held February 29th, 1916, on presentation of said claims when approved by the Chairman of the Parish Democratic Executive Committee. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Dailey. Be it resolved, that the Clerk and President of this body, be and they are hereby authorized to issue two warrants of Seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars each against the "Grand and Petit Jurors Fund" of 1916, and the "Witness Fund" of 1916, as budgeted; the said warrants to be made payable to the Parish Treasurer, for payment of witness' and jurors' certificates of 1916. Motion carried.

Motion by Mr. Dailey. Be it resolved, that warrants be issued in payment of the unpaid contingent claims of 1915, against the "existing debt fund of 1916," and be it further resolved, that whatever balance may be necessary to complete the payment of said claims, the Clerk of this body is hereby authorized to issue warrants against the unused balance of the "grand and petit jurors" and "witness fund" of 1915.
