 ORDINANCE No. 15

An Ordinance

Ordering a special election throughout the limits of 6th School District of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, to take the sense of the property taxpayers of the said school district of the said ward, entitled to vote under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana, as to whether a special tax of ten mills on the dollar, or as much thereof as may be necessary, shall be levied annually, on all taxable property in said school district, for a period of 15 years, beginning with the year of 1916; and as to whether the governing authority of said school district shall be authorized to incur debt and issue bonds of the said 6th School District of the 4th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, to the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500) Dollars, to run for a period of 15 years, bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually for the constructing, purchasing site, furnishing and maintaining the Bayou Jacques School in said school district.

Whereas, it is the voluntary will of this body to call the election hereinafter provided for, and

Whereas, Article 281 of the Constitution of 1913, and Act No. 256 of the Acts of the Legislature adopted in the year 1910, as amended by Act 218 of 1912, declared the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry to be the governing authority through which the 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of said parish may levy a special tax on all taxable property in said School District and incur debt and issue negotiable bonds for the purpose of constructing, purchasing a site, furnishing, and maintaining a school at Bayou Jacques in said School District, and

Whereas, the assessed valuation in said School District amounts to not less than Eighty Thousand Dollars and the existing bonded indebtedness incurred under Article 281 of the Constitution of 1898 and 1913, amounts to No Dollars which added to the proposed indebtedness does not exceed the Constitutional limit which said School District is authorized to incur, and

Whereas, in order to extinguish the indebtedness herein provided for, and pay off in principal and interest and bond authority to issue which is herein proposed, and to keep the public school house, in said school district in good repair and to maintain the school, after the payment of said bonds in principal and interest, it will be necessary to annually levy a special tax of not more than ten mills on the dollar, on all taxable property in said School District, which said tax when added to the existing special taxes annually levied under Article 281 of the Constitution of 1898 and 1913, will not exceed the Constitutional limit of ten mills per annum on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the property of the 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry;

Now therefore,
 Section 1. Be it ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry in lawful session convened: That an election shall be and is hereby called to be held in the 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry on the 18th day of September, A. D. 1916, at which election the majority of the property taxpayers of the said 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward, of the Parish of St. Landry,

in number and amount eligible to vote and voting at said election, shall determine the proposition:

First: To authorize the 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, through its governing authority, to incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500) Dollars to run for a period of 15 years bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable annually; the funds thus derived to be used for the purpose of constructing, purchasing a site, furnishing and maintaining a school at Bayou Jacques in said 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward.

Second: Whether the governing authorities of the 6th School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of said Parish of St. Landry, La., may annually, levy and collect a special tax on all taxable property in said school district in excess of all other taxes, sufficient to pay the interest and principal of such bonds as said governing body may be authorized to issue under the authority granted it by this ordinance and as may be necessary to operate and maintain the public school at Bayou Jacques in said school district: provided that said special tax to be levied and collected for the purpose either alone or taken in conjunction with other special taxes levied under Article 281 of the Constitution of this state shall not exceed in any one year ten mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the property of said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the ballot box necessary blanks and other necessary paraphernalia for the holding of said election shall be provided by the Secretary of the School Board, and shall cause to be printed ballots for use in said election in the following form, to-wit:

Whether the governing authorities of the Sixth School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., may, annually, levy and collect a special tax on all taxable property in said school district in excess of all other taxes sufficient to pay the interest and principal of such bonds as said governing body may be authorized to issue under the authority granted it by this ordinance and as may be necessary to operate and maintain the Bayou Jacques school of said school district: provided that said special tax to be levied and collected for that purpose either alone or taken in conjunction with other special taxes levied under Article 281 of the Constitution of this State, shall not exceed in any one year ten mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the property of said school district.

NOTICE TO THE VOTERS - To vote in favor of the two propositions submitted upon this ballot place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "Yes". To vote against it place a similar mark after the word "No". A voter may vote for one proposition and against the other, or against one and for the other.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that the compensation of the election Commissioners of said election shall be Three (\$3.00) Dollars per day, and said election shall be held at the following place, and by the officials here named, each being a qualified elector.

The polling place at said election shall be at the School House at Bayou Jacques and Fred. Walton, T. J. Clarke, and K. O'Neal are appointed commissioners and J. N. Moreland, clerk of election.

Section 4. Be it further ordained, etc., that notice of this election containing the propositions herein submitted to the voters, shall be prepared and signed by the Presi-

dent and Secretary of the School Board and shall be published by the Secretary in the official Journal by four weekly insertions, the date of the first insertion to be not less than thirty days before the date of the election. That notice shall further recite that on Thursday, the 21st. day of September, A. D. 1916, at ten o'clock A. M. the School Board will meet at its office in the City of Opelousas, Louisiana, and there in public session open the ballot box, examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of said election, and promulgate the same.

Section 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that this special election herein and hereby provided for shall be held and conducted and the returns thereof shall be made under the provisions of Act 256 of 1910 and amendments thereof, and such other laws as may be applicable.

Section 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance take effect from and after its passage.

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to an election passed by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, at its special meeting held on the 26th. day of July, 1916, I, Oliver P. Daly, President of said Board, hereby give notice that in compliance with said ordinance a special tax election will be held in School District No. Six of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on Monday, September, 18th, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers, qualified under the Constitution and Laws of this State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition, to-wit:

First: To authorize the Sixth School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, through its governing authority, to incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of Two Thousand Five Hundred (\$2,500) Dollars, to run for a period of 15 years bearing interest at the rate of five per cent per annum payable annually, the funds thus derived to be used for the purpose of constructing, purchasing a site, furnishing and maintaining and operating a public school at Bayou Jacques in said Sixth School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry.

Second. Whether the governing authorities of the Sixth School District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., may, annually, levy and collect a special tax on all taxable property in said school district in excess of all other taxes, sufficient to pay the interest and principal of such bonds as said governing body may be authorized to issue under the authority granted it by this ordinance and as may be necessary to operate and maintain the Bayou Jacques School in said district provided that said special tax to be levied and collected for that purpose, either alone or taken in conjunction with other special taxes levied under Article 281 of the Constitution of this State, shall not exceed in any one year ten mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the property of the said school district.

For the purpose of said special election, the polling place will be the Public School House at Bayou Jacques in said school district, and Fred. Walton, T. J. Clarke, and K. O'Neal, have been appointed commissioners and J. N. Moreland, has been appointed clerk of election to serve at the polling place at Bayou Jacques.

At said election the polls will be opened at seven o'clock A. M., and close at five o'clock P. M., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is hereby given that at ten o'clock A. M., on Thursday, September 21st, 1916, the said Parish School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., will meet in the office of said Board in the City of Opelousas, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and count the ballots, in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of said special election.


