ORDINANCE NO. 18.

An Ordinance

Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district the question of the levy of an additional special tax of three (3) mills (\$3.003) for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., that a special election be, and is hereby ordered, to be held in School District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on the 28th day of November, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district entitled to vote thereat the question of a levy of a special tax of Three Mills (\$3.003) on the dollar of all property in the said school district subject to state taxation, for a period of five years, beginning with the year 1917, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the secretary of the school board of the Parish of St. Landry, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy an additional three mills (.003) special tax on all property subject to taxation in school District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., annually for a period of five years, beginning with the year 1917, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

NOTICE TO VOTERS: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "Yes," to vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "No."

Section 3. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, that the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., shall meet at the office of the Parish Board in the City of Opelousas, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., on Friday, December 1st, 1916, for the purpose of examining and counting the ballots, canvassing the returns and declaring the result of said election.

Section 6. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, that the President of the School Board be, and he is hereby instructed to give the public notice of said election by proclamation, according to law.
