

ORDINANCE NO. 18.

An Ordinance

Ordering a special election to be held in School District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district the question of the levy of an additional special tax of three (3) mills (\$0.003), for the purpose of providing additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., that a special election be, and is hereby ordered to be held in School District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., on the 28th day of November, 1916, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of the said school district the question of the levy of a special tax of Three Mills (\$0.003) on the dollar of all property in the said school district subject to state taxation, for a period of five years, beginning with the year 1917, the proceeds of the said tax to be used in giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., That the ballots to be used at the said election shall be prepared by the secretary of the school board of the Parish of St. Landry, and shall be in the following form:

Proposition to levy an additional three mills (0.003) special tax on all property subject to taxation in school District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., annually for a period of five years, beginning with the year 1917, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of the said school district.

NOTICE TO VOTERS: To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot, place a cross (x) mark in the square after the word "Yes"; to vote against it, place a similar mark after the word "No".

Section 3. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, That the secretary of the School Board be, and he is hereby ordered to cause to be prepared for use at the said election the tally sheets, list of qualified

electors, assessed valuation of property blank statements for the compilation of the vote, in number and amount, and other election blanks that may be required for the purpose of holding the election, to cause the same to be placed in the ballot box for use at the polling precinct, and to make provision for the transmission of the ballot box to the precinct of the district at which the election is to be held.

Section 4. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, That the polling place or precinct for the said election shall be in the Town Hall in the Town of Washington, St. Landry Parish, La., and the following three commissioners and clerk of election are appointed to serve at said election: O. D. Orteg, Sosthene Pitre and Arthur Deshotels, commissioners, and Jonas W. Bailey, Sr., clerk, whose compensation for services in holding said election shall be three dollars per day, each commissioner being a qualified elector. And said election shall be conducted under the laws of the State applicable thereto.

Section 5. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, That the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., shall meet at the office of the Parish Board in the City of Opelousas, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., on Friday, the 1st day of December, 1916, for the purpose, in open session, of examining and counting the ballots, canvassing the returns and declaring the result of said election.

Section 6. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, That the President of the School Board be, and he is hereby instructed to give the public notice of said election by proclamation, according to law.

Section 7. Be it further ordained by the School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, That the special election herein and hereby provided for shall be held and conducted and the returns thereof shall be made under the provisions of Act 256 of 1910 and amendments thereof, and such other laws as may be applicable.

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to an ordinance passed by School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., at a regular meeting held on October 2nd, 1916, I, O. P. To levy an additional special tax of three mills on the dollar on all property in School District No. 4 of the 5th Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, La., subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of five years, beginning with the year 1917, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said district.

For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be in the Town Hall in the Town of Washington, La., and the following commissioners and clerk have been appointed to serve at this election: O. D. Orteg, Sosthene Pitre and Arthur Deshotels, Com-

missioners and Jonas W. Bailey, Sr., clerk.

At said special school election the poll will open at seven o'clock A. M. and close at five o'clock P. M., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at 10:00 o'clock A. M. on Friday, December 1st, 1916, the said School Board of the Parish of St. Landry, La., will meet at the office of the Board in the City of Opelousas, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot box, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the result of said special election.

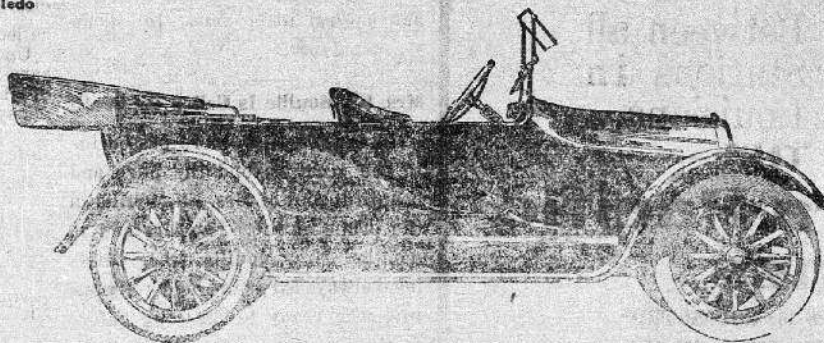
