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CEEDINGS OF THE POLICE JURY

Opelousas, La., Jan. 6, 1919. Police jury met in regular session this day of January, 1919, with the following members present: W. P. Pavy, president, presiding; St. Cyr, Larcade, Evans, Beaug, W. F. Brown, Rushing, McCoy, Sylvestre.

Notice to Voters—To vote in favor of the proposition submitted on this ballot, or either of them, the voter should mark the square after the word "Yes," opposite the proposition voted on; to vote against said proposition, or either of them, the voter should mark after the word "No," opposite the proposition voted on.
