SCHOOL BOARD PROCEEDINGS.

Opelousas, La., July 7th, 1919.

The School Board of the Parish of  
St. Landry met in regular session on  
Monday, July 7th, 1919, with the fol-  
lowing members present: Dr. O. P.  
Daly, president, Mr. L. L. Perrault,  
Mr. H. D. Larcade, Jr., Mr. J. A. Durio,  
Mr. G. Horaist, Dr. L. A. Guidry, Mr.  
Tilden Meche, Mr. Jos. Benoit, Jr.,  
Mr. R. Lee Hawkins, Mr. Arthur Fogle-  
man, Mr. Paul W. Lafleur, Mr. Frank  
Fontenot, Mr. G. R. Baillie, Mr. W. B.  
Baker, Mr. C. N. Bertrand, Mr. J.  
W. Lyman and a full membership.

On motion of Mr. Perrault the read-  
ing of the minutes of the last meeting  
was dispensed with and the minutes  
as published were adopted.

The term of the president, Dr. O. P.  
Daly, having expired, Mr. Perrault,  
duly seconded, moved that Mr. O. P.  
Daly be and he is hereby re-elected  
president of the school board of the  
Parish of St. Landry for a term of six  
years. Unanimously carried.

No vice-president of the board hav-  
ing been elected to fill that position  
No vice-president of the board hav-  
ing as a member of the board, Mr.  
Durio, duly seconded, moved the elec-  
tion of Mr. L. L. Perrault as vice-  
president of the school for his unex-  
pired term. Unanimously carried.

Report of Executive Committee

Opelousas, La., July 3rd, 1919.

To the President and Members of the

Unanimously carried.

Mr. Durio, duly seconded, moved  
that the superintendent be and he is  
hereby authorized to pay the sidewalk  
certificates, now due, and which will  
become due, against the Opelousas  
high school and the Eunice high  
school from the funds of said school  
districts. Carried.

Mr. Horaist, duly seconded, moved

that a former resolution be and the  
same is hereby amended so as to read  
as follows: That the unexpended bal-  
ance in school district No. 1 of the sec-  
ond Police Jury ward be used in the  
repair and improvement of the  
Bristol and the Sunset schools and  
that the superintendent be authorized  
to have such work done and the ex-  
terior of the Bristol school painted.  
Unanimously carried.

Dr. Guidry, duly seconded, moved  
that the superintendent and members  
of the first ward and they are here-  
by given full power to dispose of the  
remaining part of the old Opelousas  
high school building to the best ad-  
vantage. Unanimously carried.

Dr. Guidry, duly seconded, moved  
that the superintendent be and he is  
hereby authorized to purchase such  
incidentals as may be necessary for  
the schools of the parish. Unanimously  
carried.

Mr. Hawkins, duly seconded, moved  
that the superintendent be and he is  
hereby authorized to use three  
hundred (\$300.00) dollars of the funds  
of Bayou Current school district and  
two hundred (\$200.00) dollars of the  
funds of the Bayou Jack school dis-  
trict for the purpose of constructing  
a school building on or near the line  
between these two districts in the low-  
er Bayou Jack settlement. Unani-  
mously carried.

On motion of Mr. Perrault, duly se-  
conded, the following ordinance was of-  
fered and adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 47

An Ordinance—  
Levying a special tax in aid of  
public schools and for the payment  
of bonds and interest authorized and  
issued by virtue of the authority  
vested in this board by law.

Be it ordained by the school board  
of the Parish of St. Landry, in lawful  
session convened, that the following  
tax on all the taxable property is here-  
by levied in the various school dis-  
tricts of the Parish of St. Landry  
hereinafter mentioned for the year  
1919.

In school district No. 1 of the first  
Police Jury ward a tax of three (3)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of paying the bonds  
and interest of said school district  
as they mature; and a tax of two and  
one-half (2 1-2) mills on the dollar to  
give additional aid and maintain the  
schools of said district.

In school district No. 2 of the first  
Police Jury ward a tax of three (3)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of paying the bonds  
and interest of said district as they  
mature and to give additional aid and  
to maintain the schools of said school  
district.

In school district No. 1 of the fourth  
Police Jury ward a tax of two (2)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of paying the bonds  
and interest of said district as they  
mature; and a tax of two (2) mills on  
the dollar to give additional aid to  
maintain the schools of said district.

In school district No. 2 of the fourth  
Police Jury ward a tax of two (2)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of paying the bonds  
and interest of said district as they  
mature; and a tax of two (2) mills on  
the dollar to give additional aid to

In school district No. 3 of the fourth

Police Jury ward a tax of four (4)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of paying the bonds  
and interest of said district as they  
mature and to give additional aid and  
to maintain the schools of said district.

In school district No. 8 of the fourth  
Police Jury ward a tax of three (3)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of paying the bonds  
and interest as they mature and to  
give additional aid and to maintain  
the schools of said district.

In school district No. 3 of the fifth  
Police Jury ward a tax of five (5)  
mills on the dollar is hereby levied  
for the purpose of giving additional  
aid and to maintain the schools of  
said district.
