Debate Exclusion

Oh, the pity and the shame of it that so many of our ordinarily good Catholic women of all classes and of nearly every age, married as well as single, mothers as well as daughters,

are the servile imitators of the unmodest fashions of the day! To such an extent have some of them lost the natural modesty and shrinking delicacy of their sex that they hesitate not come before the Holly of Hollies and approach the sacred table in such scant apparel as must needs make the angels veil their faces with their wings. We have seriously debated with ourselves whether we are not bound in conscience to exclude such

women from the House of God Whose Vicar on earth would not tolerate their presence for a moment. Our patient forbearance and wish to spare them a painful humiliation must not be considered as a weak connivance of their scandalous violation of the sanctity of God's House.

Parents Responsible
