Mr. M. J. Godeau, offered the following ordinance, seconded by Mr. W. C. Dejean, and upon being duly read was adopted unanimously, to-wit:

**An Ordinance**  
 Levying a special tax of five (5) mills on the dollar on all taxable property situated in the Fourth Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of St. Landry parish, La., for the year 1920;

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the parish of St. Landry, in regular session convened; that

Whereas, a special election was duly held in the Fourth Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of St. Landry Parish, La., on the 22nd day of January, A. D. 1920, at which election was submitted the proposition as to whether said road district, through its proper governing body, should be authorized to incur debt and issue negotiable bonds to the amount of Seventy-five thousand dollars, (\$75,000.00), to run for a period of from one to thirty years; and as to whether

the governing authority of said Road District should be authorized to levy annually a tax sufficient to meet the payment of the bonds and interest as same mature; and

Whereas, said proposition was duly carried and the result of said election duly canvassed and promulgated by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, on the 2nd day of February, A. D. 1920; and

Whereas, the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, the governing body of said Road District, has authorized the president and secretary of its body to issue said bonds in accordance with the authority vested in it by virtue of said special election; and

Whereas, a tax of five mills on the dollar on all property subject to taxation in said Road District will be required to retire interest coupons maturing on January 1st, and July 1st, 1921, as also a surplus to be accumulated to retire the bonds maturing on July 1st, 1923;

Section 1. Be it ordained, that a special road tax of five mills on the

dollar be, and the same is hereby levied for the year 1920, on all property subject to taxation in the Fourth Road District of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of St. Landry parish, for the purpose of paying the interest coupons maturing on January 1st, and July 1st, 1920; and also for the purpose of accumulating an amount sufficient to retire the bonds maturing on July 1st, 1923; said tax to be collected at the same time and in the same manner as all other taxes are collected.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that the assessor of the parish of St. Landry be notified of this levy, to the end that he may carry said tax on his assessment roll for the year 1920.

Section 3. Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance take effect from and after its promulgation.
