Proceedings of the Police Jury

Opelousas, La., Nov. 15, 1920.

The police jury met in regular and lawful session this fifteenth day of November, 1920, pursuant to adjournment for the purpose of canvassing the returns and promulgating the result of the special election held in the 3rd Road District, 4th police jury ward, of St. Landry parish on Thursday, November 11th, 1920; notice of which was duly published.

The following members were present at roll call:

Dr. F. O. Pavy, president, presiding; Messrs. St. Cyr, Mills, Dupre, Guidroz, Phillips, Clouton, McCaffery, Sylvestre, Cummings.

Absent: Messrs. D. P. Moreau, W. F. Brown, M. J. Godeau, Arthur Deshotel, W. C. Dejean and Eloi Guillory.

Motion by Mr. McCaffery. That a committee of two be appointed with the clerk of this body to canvass the returns of the election held in the Third Road District, 4th police jury ward of St. Landry parish, La., on Thursday, the 11th day of November, 1920. Motion carried. Chair appointed Messrs. J. T. St. Cyr and Thos. McCaffery.

The committee composed of Messrs. J. T. St. Cyr and Thos. McCaffery, assisted by the clerk of this body, and duly appointed to canvass the returns of the election held in the third (3rd) road district, 4th police jury ward, parish of St. Landry, La., on Thursday, November 11th, 1920, in open and regular session of the police jury, did canvass the returns of said election and reported the results thereof, as follows, to-wit:

Motion carried. Mr. Alex Sylvestre offered the following ordinance, seconded by Mr. Thos. McCaffery, to-wit:

Upon motion of Mr. R. L. Mills, the report of committee on the canvass of the returns of said road bond election held in the third (3rd) road district, 4th police jury ward, St. Landry parish La., on November 11, 1920, was received and accepted and an ordinance ordered drafted in accordance therewith, and the promulgation of said election be published according to law.

Motion carried. Mr. Alex Sylvestre offered the following ordinance, seconded by Mr. Thos. McCaffery, to-wit:

AN ORDINANCE Whereas on Thursday, the 11th day of November, 1920, an election was held in the Third (3rd) Road District, Fourth Police Jury Ward of the parish of St. Landry, La., to determine the following proposition, to-wit:

"Proposition to incur debt and issue serial negotiable bonds of Road District Number Three (3) of the Fourth

(4th) Police Jury Ward of St. Landry parish, State of Louisiana, in addition to the debt previously incurred and bonds previously issued for said district said additional debt to be incurred and bonds to be issued to the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00), and said bonds to be serial bonds running from one to twenty years, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually, said additional debt to be incurred and bonds issued for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public roads and highways within the territorial limits of said road district and particularly for the purpose of completing the gravel highway already surveyed under the direction of the State Highway Department, commencing at the eastern limit of said road district, just west of the village of Palmetto and running in a general northerly direction parallel to the Texas and Pacific railway to the northern limit of said road district, being the Avoyelles-St. Landry parish line, said gravel highway to be constructed under the direction and supervision of the State Highway Department and with the financial assistance of the state of Louisiana and of the United States government, if such assistance be obtainable.

Whereas the returns of said election were duly canvassed by the Police Jury of the parish of St. Landry according to law and notice to that effect given on the 5th day of October, 1920, and the result of said election was declared to be that said proposition had been carried in favor of said proposition, as follows, to-wit:

Majority in favor of issuance of bonds, thirty-nine (39) votes in number; and One Hundred Seventy Thousand and Seven Hundred and Ten Dollars (\$170,710.00) in amount of property valuation.

Now, therefore be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry in regular session convened that said proposition having been carried at said election the result thereof shall be promulgated by the president and clerk of the police jury by the publication of one issue of the official journal under their respective signatures and this shall be their authority for so doing.

The foregoing ordinance was duly read and considered and a majority of the members elect being present voted as follows:

Promulgation of Result of Election STATE OF LOUISIANA, Parish of St. Landry.

By direction of the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, notice is hereby given that on Thursday November 11th, 1920 an election was held in the third (3rd) road district, 4th police jury ward of the parish of St. Landry, La. to determine the following proposition, to-wit:

"Proposition to incur debt and issue serial negotiable bonds of Road District Number Three (3) of the Fourth (4th) police jury ward of St. Landry parish, State of Louisiana in addition to the debt previously incurred and bonds previously issued for said District, said additional debt to be incurred and bonds to be issued to the amount of sixty thousand dollars, (\$60,000.00) and said bonds to be serial bonds running from one to twenty years, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5) per annum, payable semi-annually, said additional debt to be incurred and bonds issued for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public roads and highways within the territorial limits of said road district and particularly for the purpose of completing the gravel highway already surveyed under the direction of the state highway department commencing at the eastern limit of said road district just west of the village of Palmetto, and running in a general northerly direction parallel to the Texas & Pacific railway to the northern limit of said road district being the Avoyelles-St. Landry parish line said gravel highway to be constructed under the direction and supervision of the state highway department and with the financial assistance of the state of Louisiana and of the United States Government, if such assistance be obtainable."

The result of said count showed that said proposition was carried in favor of said proposition and take further notice that the vote in favor of said proposition was as follows, to-wit:

Majority in favor of issuance of bonds: 39 votes in number, and \$170,710.00, in amount of valuation of property.

Therefore, it is hereby publicly announced, proclaimed and promulgated that the proposition submitted and above set forth was duly carried and that said election was therefore favorable to said proposition.
