—CHARTER OF THE—

CONGREGATION OF HOLY GHOST Roman Catholic Church of St. Landry Parish, Louisiana.

State of Louisiana, Parish of St. Landry.

Be it known, that on this twenty-seventh day of the month of November A. D. 1920, and of the Independence of the United States of America the One Hundred and Forty-fourth, before me, William J. Sandoz, a Notary Public duly commissioned, qualified and sworn, in and for the above parish and state, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared, His Lordship Jules B. Jeanmard, Bishop of Lafayette, of the Roman Catholic Church, a resident of the parish of Lafayette, State of Louisiana; Very Reverend J. M. Langlois, vicar general of the Roman Catholic Church for the diocese of Lafayette, La. a resident of Iberia parish, State of Louisiana; the Reverend James A. Hyland, pastor of the congregation of Holy Ghost Roman Catholic Church of St. Landry parish, La., a resident of the above parish and state, and Frank Pickery and Ernest Chachere, members of said congregation and residents of the above parish and state, who severally declared that, availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the state of Louisiana, relative to the organization of corporations for literary, scientific, religious, charitable and other purposes, they have covenanted and agreed, and do by these presents covenant and agree and bind themselves, as well as such persons as may hereafter become associated with them, or succeed them, to form and constitute a corporation and body politic in law, for the purposes and stipulations set forth in the following articles, which they do hereby adopt as their Charter, to-wit:

Article I.

This corporation shall be known, designated and styled "The Congregation of Holy Ghost Roman Catholic Church" of the parish of St. Landry, Louisiana, for the use of the colored race, and its domicile is hereby fixed in the said parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, and said corporation

shall have power and authority, in its corporate name, to contract, sue and be sued, hold, receive, purchase and convey as well as mortgage and hypothecate, lease and pledge, property, both real and personal, and shall also have power to receive by donation and by bequest, money and property of all kinds as provided for by the laws of this state, and generally to enjoy all the privileges granted by said laws to corporations of this nature.

Article II.

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is formed are hereby declared to be: The holding and administering of property, real, personal and mixed, for religious purposes, so that the same may be devoted to religious services for the benefit of those who attend the Roman Catholic Church belonging to this corporation.

Article III.

Said corporation shall be managed, administered and controlled by a Board of five directors, which said first board is hereby declared to be composed of His Lordship Jules B. Jeanmard, Bishop as aforesaid, of Very Reverend J. M. Langlois, vicar general as aforesaid, of the Reverend James A. Hyland, pastor as aforesaid, and Frank Pickery and Ernest Chachere, members of said congregation. The officers of said corporation shall be a president, a vice-president, and a secretary and treasurer, whose duties shall be such as their respective offices imply, and as may be prescribed by the by-laws of this corporation. His Lordship Jules B. Jeanmard, Bishop as aforesaid, his successor or the diocesan administrator, or such other person as may be appointed according to the rules of the Roman Catholic Church, administrator of the diocese, for the time being, shall be ex-officio president; the said Very Reverend J. M. Langlois, vicar general as aforesaid, his successor, or such other persons may be appointed according to the rules of the Roman Catholic Church, to perform the duties of Vicar General of the diocese for the time being, shall be vice-president; and the said Reverend James A. Hyland, or his lawful successor as long as he shall be recognized as pastor as aforesaid by the Bishop, or diocesan administrator, shall be secretary and treasurer; the said Frank Pickery and Ernest Chachere, the two

laymen, members of said board, shall be and remain in office as such directors as aforesaid, for the term of two years from and after the first Monday of January, 1921, and until their successors are chosen, and at the expiration of the term of office of said two laymen, and on the first Monday in January, biennially, thereafter, or whenever a vacancy shall exist in the office held by said two laymen, as directors, or either of them, whether caused by expiration of the term of office, death, migration, disability or in any manner whatsoever, the office or offices of directors, as aforesaid, shall be filled by the Bishop or administrator of the diocese as aforesaid. The other three members of said board, to-wit: His Lordship, the Bishop, the Vicar General and the pastor of said congregation, shall be and remain members of this corporation and members of the board of directors thereof as long as they shall respectively remain Bishop, Vicar General of the said diocese, and the Pastor of said congregation, and whenever either or all of them shall cease to be Bishop, Vicar General or Pastor as aforesaid, then and in that case, their respective successors as said Bishop, Vicar General and Pastor, shall be and become their respective successors as members of this corporation and as members of the board of directors thereof and have respectively said offices of president, vice-president and secretary and treasurer, and in like manner, they shall have uninterrupted succession.

The said board of directors alone, as aforesaid, and their respective successors in office, shall have power to transact all business of this corporation of whatsoever nature, but no debt exceeding Two Hundred Dollars shall be contracted by this corporation without the consent of the Bishop or Diocesan Administrator, and no real estate belonging to it shall be sold, mortgaged or disposed of in any way, without the vote and consent of all the five directors. The board of directors shall have the power to make and pass such by-laws for the regulation of the affairs of this corporation, as they may deem fit, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state or of the United States or the discipline authority of the Roman Catholic Church and to alter, repeal or amend same in whole or in part.

Article IV.

This corporation is formed without capital stock, and is to exist and continue for five hundred years. All citations and other legal process shall be served on the secretary of this corporation, and in the event of his absence or inability to act, from any cause whatever, then upon the president thereof.

Thus done and passed at my office, at Opelousas, La., on the day, month and year herein first-above written, in the presence of Jas. Auzenne, J. Green and Preston Stelly, competent witnesses, who herewith sign their names with the said applicants, and me Notary, after reading of the whole. (Signed)
