Proceedings of the Police Jury

Mr. B. W. Clouton offered the following ordinance, duly seconded, to-wit:

An Ordinance Whereas, an election was held in the Third Road District, Fourth Police Jury Ward of the Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, on the 11th day of November, 1920, in pursuance to an ordinance adopted by the Police Jury of said parish and State, on the 5th day of October, 1920, notice of which was published according to law; and,

Whereas, the question submitted at said election was to determine the proposition:

"Proposition to incur debt and issue serial negotiable bonds of Road District Number Three (3) of the Fourth Police Jury Ward of St. Landry parish, State of Louisiana, in addition to the debt previously incurred and bonds previously issued for said district, said additional debt to be incurred and bonds to be issued to the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars, (\$60,000), and said bonds to be serial bonds running from one to twenty years, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5) per annum payable semi-annually; said additional debt to be incurred and bonds issued for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public roads and highways within the territorial limits of said road district, and particularly for the purpose of completing the gravel highway already surveyed under the direction of the State Highway Department, commencing at the eastern limit of said Road District, just west of the Village of Palmotte, and running in a general north-westerly direction parallel to the Texas & Pacific Railway to the northern limit of said Road District, being the Avoyelles and Landry parish line, said gravel highway to be constructed under the direction and supervision of the State Highway Department, and with the financial assistance of the State of Louisiana and of the United States government, if such assistance be obtainable."

Whereas, said proposition was lawfully carried at said election as shown by the process verbal of the police jury canvassing the returns of said election on the 15th day of November, 1920; and,

Whereas, the result of said election was duly promulgated on the 15th day of November, 1920, as required by law, and no contest has been filed notwithstanding more than sixty days have elapsed since the date of said promulgation; and

Whereas, the police jury of the parish of St. Landry is recognized by the constitution and laws of this state to be the governing authority of said road district; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, La., in regular and lawful session convened:

Section 1. That the president and clerk of this police jury shall be and are hereby authorized for and on behalf of the Third Road District, Fourth Police Jury Ward of the parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, to incur debt to the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars, (\$60,000), and to make and sign serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District therefor, numbered consecutively from one (1) to sixty (60), both inclusive, the first of which shall become due on the first day of September, 1922, and the last shall mature on the 1st day of Sept. 1941, and which shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5) per annum, payable semi-annually from date, with interest coupons attached to each bond.

Section 2. That the proceeds of said bond issue, when negotiated, shall be deposited in the treasury of said parish, and there shall be and remain as a trust fund to be used only for the purpose for which the same were raised as set forth in the preamble hereof.

Section 3. That said bonds shall be of date the first day of September, A. D., 1921, and shall begin to mature on the first day of September, A. D., 1922, and shall become due and payable each year thereafter until including the first day of September, A. D., 1941, and shall be in number and amounts as follows: Sixty bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, and dates of maturity as follows, to-wit:

D., One of the Treasurer of the United States of America, in lawful money of the United States of America, with interest thereon at the rate of five per cent (5) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of March and September of each and every year from the first day of September, A. D., 1921, upon presentation and surrender of the coupons hereto attached, as same may mature.

This bond is one of a series of sixty bonds of the denomination of \$1,000.00 each, and numbered from one (1) to sixty (60), issued by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, in pursuance to an election held in said Road District, on Thursday, November 11th, 1920, the result of which was duly canvassed, declared, promulgated and registered according to law, of which said election there was no contest and none can now be lawfully made.

And it is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required to be done precedent to and in the issuance of said bonds have been properly done, have happened and have been performed in regular form and duly as required by law, and that said indebtedness does not exceed any statutory or constitutional limitations.

In testimony whereof, and by authority of an ordinance of the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, state of Louisiana, lawfully adopted on the seventh day of February, 1921 and now recorded in the mortgage office of the state of Louisiana, in and for the parish of St. Landry, I, F. Each bond shall be signed by the president of the police jury and the clerk thereof, and the said officers are hereby required to have written, printed or engraved on the reverse of said bonds the following certificate:

Which certificate after the delays provided by law have expired and in accordance with Section 31 of Act 256 of the general assembly of the state of Louisiana, for the year 1910, and the laws amendatory thereof, shall be signed by the secretary of state of the State of Louisiana, and have attached thereto the great seal of the state of Louisiana. The interest coupons attached to said bonds shall have printed or engraved thereon the fac-simile signatures of the president and clerk of the police jury.

And when said bonds are thus issued and registered by the secretary of state according to law, they shall be taken into possession by the clerk of the police jury and by him held until negotiated.

Section 4. That when said bonds have been signed, issued, registered and returned to the clerk of the police jury, they shall be ready for negotiation and the president of the police jury is hereby authorized fully for that purpose.

Section 5. That the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, La., shall levy on all taxable property in said road district in accordance with law, at the same time as other taxes are levied, in addition to all other taxes now authorized by the constitution and laws including any special tax, a tax above all said taxes sufficient to pay the interest and principal of the bonds herein directed to be issued as the same may mature; which tax may be levied and extended on the assessment rolls at any time prior to the final collection of taxes due for that particular year; and when collected, shall be used for no other purpose than that of retiring maturing bonds and coupons.

Section 6. That the clerk of the police jury shall cause the original of this ordinance to be recorded in the mortgage records of the parish of St. Landry, and also published in the St. Landry Clarion, the official journal of the parish of St. Landry, according to law.

An Ordinance Whereas, an election was held in the Fourteenth (14) Road District of the parish of St. Landry, state of Louisiana, on the 21st day of October, 1920, in pursuance to an ordinance of the police jury adopted on the seventh day of September, 1920, notice of which was published according to law; and

Whereas, one of the questions submitted at said election was to determine the proposition:

"First-Proposition to incur debt and to issue serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District to the amount of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$300,000.00), to run for periods of from one (1) to twenty-four (24) years, bearing interest payable semi-annually, at the rate of five per cent (5) per annum for the purpose of constructing a permanent public road and the necessary bridges and culverts therefor, and for acquiring rights-of-way, etc., commonly known as the Pershing Highway, (formerly Evangeline Highway), starting from the line of division between the parishes of St. Landry and Avoyelles, near Gold Dust, and running in said district near or through Barbreeck, Whiteville, Garland, Beggs, Washington, Opelousas, Shuteston, Sunset, Grand Coteau and on to the line of division between the parishes of St. Landry and Lafayette, title to which said public road, bridges and culverts shall vest in the public; said public road, bridges and culverts to be constructed under the direction and supervision of the state highway department, and with the financial assistance of the state of Louisiana and of the United States if such assistance be obtainable; and

Whereas, said proposition was lawfully carried at said election as shown by the process verbal of the police jury canvassing the returns of said election on the First day of November, 1920; and

Whereas, the result of said election was duly promulgated on the First day of November, 1920, as required by law, and no contest has been filed notwithstanding more than sixty days have elapsed since the date of said promulgation; and

Whereas, the police jury of the parish of St. Landry is recognized by the constitution and laws of this state to be the governing authority of said road district; now, therefore,

Be it ordained, by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, in regular and lawful session convened:

That in compliance with the terms of Article 281 of the constitution of the state of Louisiana and Act 258 of the general assembly of the state of Louisiana for the year 1910, as amended, and acting as the governing authority of road district No. 14 of the parish of St. Landry and the said police jury having been duly authorized at an election held in the said Road District on the 21st day of October, 1920, hereby authorizes the incurring of an indebtedness of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$300,000.00), on behalf of said road district for the purpose of constructing a permanent public road and the necessary bridges and culverts therefor, and for acquiring rights-of-way, etc., commonly known as the Pershing Highway, (formerly Evangeline Highway), starting from a point on the line of division between the parishes of St. Landry and Avoyelles, near Gold Dust, and running in said district near or through Barbreeck, Whiteville, Duboujeon, Garland, Beggs, Washington, Opelousas, Shuteston, Sunset, Grand Coteau, and on the line of division between the parishes of St. Landry and Lafayette, title to which said public road, bridges and culverts shall vest in the public; and does hereby authorize the issuance of \$300,000.00 of road bonds of Road District No. 14 of the parish of St. Landry, numbered from one (1) to three hundred (300), inclusive, of the denomination of \$1,000 each, dated September 1,

1921, and bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5) per annum from date until paid; said interest being payable on the first days of March and September in each year, and each of said bonds having attached thereto semi-annual interest coupons to represent the said interest; and

Be it further ordained, etc., that the said bonds and the interest coupons thereon, shall be payable at the office of the treasurer of the parish of St. Landry, at Opelousas, Louisiana, or at the option of the holder at the National Park Bank in the City of New York, State of New York.

ANNUAL PERSHING WAY CONVENTION IN RUSTON

Advices received here by Arthur W. VanPelt, president of the state organization, are to the effect that Ruston is planning a welcome to the delegates that will exemplify to the fullest extent the motto of the highway "The Friendly Way."

Word has been received that Herbert F. McDougal, general secretary and manager of the Pershing Way, will come to Louisiana especially for the meeting at Ruston and will bring with him full evidence of the wonderful development of the highway throughout the north.

Reports received from all parts of Louisiana show splendid work done during the past year toward the completion of the highway. Bond issues aggregating more than four millions of dollars were authorized through the efforts of Pershing Way organizations, and as the result of Pershing Way activities.
