AN ORDINANCE.

Whereas, an election was held in the Second Road District, Fourth Police Jury Ward of the parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, on Thursday, the 23rd day of December, 1920, in pursuance to an ordinance adopted by the police jury of said parish on the 3rd day of November, 1920, notice of which was published according to law; and

Whereas, the question submitted at said election was to determine the proposition:

Proposition, to incur debt and issue serial negotiable bonds of Road District Number Two (2) of the Fourth (4) Police Jury Ward of St. Landry parish, State of Louisiana, in addition to the debt previously incurred and bonds previously issued for said road district, said additional debt to be incurred and bonds to be issued to the amount of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars, (\$150,000.00), and said bonds to be serial bonds running from one (1) to thirty (30) years, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum (5) per annum, payable semi-annually, said additional debt to be incurred and bonds issued for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public roads and highways within the territorial limits of said road district, and particularly for the purpose of completing the Melville-Palmetto Highway and for the construction of a gravel road along the Atchafalaya River and that portion of the Palmetto-Bayou Rouge road lying within the boundaries of the said Second Road District."

Whereas, said proposition was lawfully carried at said election as shown by the process verbal of the police jury canvassing the returns of said election on the 3rd day of January, 1921; and

Whereas, the result of said election was duly promulgated on the 3rd day of January, 1921, as required by law, and no contest has been filed notwithstanding more than sixty days have elapsed since the date of said promulgation; and

Whereas, the police jury of the parish of St. Landry is recognized by the Constitution and laws of this state to be the governing authority of said road district; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, in regular and lawful session convened:

Section 1. That the president and clerk of this police jury shall be and are hereby authorized for and on behalf of the Second Road District, Fourth Police Jury Ward of the parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, to incur debt to the amount of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), and to make and sign serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District thereon, numbered consecutively from one (1) to one hundred and fifty, (150), both inclusive, the first of which shall become due on the first day of September, 1922, and the last shall mature on the 1st day of September, 1951, and which shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5) per annum, payable semi-annually from date, with interest coupons attached to each bond, as follows: Section 2. That the proceeds of said bond issue, when negotiated, shall be deposited in the treasury of said parish, and there shall be and remain as a trust fund to be used only for the purpose for which the same were raised as set forth in the preamble hereof.

Section 3. That said bonds shall be of date the first day of September, A. D. 1921, and shall begin to mature on the first day of September, A. D. 1922, and shall become due payable each year thereafter until and including the first day of September, A. Section 6. That the clerk of the police jury shall cause the original of this ordinance to be recorded in the mortgage records of the parish of St. Landry, and also published in the St. Landry Clarion, the official journal of the parish of St. Landry, according to law.

Section 7. Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance take effect from and after its promulgation.

Mr. E. M. Dupre, offered the following ordinance, duly seconded, to-wit: AN ORDINANCE.

Whereas, an election was held in the Fourteenth (14th) Road District of the parish of St. Landry, state of Louisiana, on the 21st day of October, 1920, in pursuance to an ordinance of the police jury adopted on the seventh day of September, 1920, notice of which was published according to law; and

Whereas, one of the questions submitted at said election was to determine the proposition: "First-Proposition to incur debt and to issue serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District to the amount of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$300,000.00), to run for periods of from one (1) to twenty-four (24) years, bearing interest payable semi-annually, at the rate of five per cent (5) per annum, for the purpose of constructing a permanent public road and the necessary bridges and culverts therefor, and for acquiring right-of-way, etc., commonly known as the Pershing Highway, (formerly Evangeline Highway), starting from a point on the line of division between the parishes of St. Landry and Ayozeles, near Gold Dust, and running in said district near or through Barbree, Whiteville, Dubuisson, Garland, Beggs, Washington, Opelousas, Shuteston, Sunset, Grand Coteau, and on to the line of division between the parishes of St. Landry and Lafayette, title to which said public road, bridges and culverts shall vest in the public; said public road, vestiges and culverts to be constructed under the direction and supervision of the state highway department and with the financial assistance of the state of Louisiana and of the United States if such assistance be obtainable;" and

Whereas, said proposition was lawfully carried at said election as shown by the process verbal of the police jury canvassing the returns of said election on the First day of November, 1920; and

Whereas, the result of said election was duly promulgated on the First day of November, 1920, as required by law; and

Whereas, the police jury of the parish of St. Landry is recognized by the Constitution and laws of this state to be the governing authority of said Road District; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the police jury of the parish of St. Landry, in regular and lawful session convened:

Section 1. That the president and clerk of this police jury shall be and are hereby authorized for and on behalf of the Second Road District, Fourth Police Jury Ward of the parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, to incur debt to the amount of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00), and to make and sign serial negotiable coupon bonds of said Road District thereon, numbered consecutively from one (1) to one hundred and fifty, (150), both inclusive, the first of which shall become due on the first day of September, 1922, and the last shall mature on the 1st day of September, 1951, and which shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent (5) per annum, payable semi-annually from date, with interest coupons attached to each bond, as follows: Section 2. That the proceeds of said bond issue, when negotiated, shall be deposited in the treasury of said parish, and there shall be and remain as a trust fund to be used only for the purpose for which the same were raised as set forth in the preamble hereof.

Section 3. That said bonds shall be of date the first day of September, A. D. 1921, and shall begin to mature on the first day of September, A. D. 1922, and shall become due payable each year thereafter until and including the first day of September, A. D. 1951, and shall be in numbers and amounts as follows: One Hundred and Fifty bonds of the denomination of \$1,000 each, and dates of maturity as follows, to-wit:
