Proceedings of the Board of Aldermen

Opelousas, La., Nov. 1, 1921. This being the regular meeting of the board of aldermen, and it being a legal holiday, it was ordered by the mayor, no quorum being present that the meeting be adjourned to reconvene on Friday, November 4th, 1921, at seven o'clock, P. M.

Present: E. L. Loeb, mayor, presiding; Aldermen: A. C. Mouret, J. A. Dejean, L. L. Danel and Simon Stelly. Absent: Alderman C. P. Dunbar. Quorum present. Meeting called to order.

On motion, duly seconded, and carried the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting was dispensed with. The monthly reports of officers were received as read, and ordered filed, and the city treasurer credited with the sum of \$7196.27 and vouchers for this amount cancelled.

Mr. Mouret offered the following ordinance: SPECIAL ASSESSMENT Ordinance No. 1 of 1921. To assess sidewalks and curbs.

Ordering the construction of cement sidewalks and curbing on certain streets within the corporate limits of the city of Opelousas, Louisiana, describing in general terms the contemplated improvement, and authorizing the clerk of the board of aldermen of the city of Opelousas, La., to advertise for bids for said work.

Section I. Be it ordained by the mayor and board of aldermen of the city of Opelousas, La., that the construction of cement sidewalks and curbing on the following streets of the city of Opelousas, La., be and are hereby ordered, as follows:

On the North side of Landry street from Southern Pacific railroad to Western Corporate limits of the city containing approximately 2390 lineal feet.

On south side of Landry street, from Southern Pacific railroad to Western Corporate limits of the city containing approximately 2807 lineal feet.

On North side of Grolee street, from Texas & Pacific railroad to Colgate Avenue, containing approximately 390 lineal feet.

On R. R. ave., East side, from Landry street to Vine street, containing approximately 340 lineal feet.

On South side of Grolee street, from Southern Pacific railroad to Texas & Pacific railroad, containing approximately 730 lineal feet.

On Warrielle avenue East side, from Landry street to Vine street, containing approximately 300 lineal feet.

Section II. Be it further ordained, etc., that the work hereinabove ordered shall be done in conformity with the plans, and specifications prepared by the city engineer, and which are on file in his office, and said work to be done under the provisions of Act 131 of the general assembly of Louisiana of the year 1904, insofar as said statute relates to the construction of sidewalks and curbing.

Section III. Be it further ordained, etc., that the clerk of this board be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the construction of the sidewalks and curbing hereinabove ordered, said bids to be submitted at the next regular meeting of this board, and said advertisement to contain the reservation of the right by this city to reject any and all bids submitted for

said work. That said call for bids shall contain a general description of the contemplated work, shall refer to the plans and specifications on file in the city engineer's office, and covering the aforesaid work, and shall designate the hour, date and place for the reception and opening of said bids.

Section IV. Be it further ordained, etc., that the total cost of constructing said sidewalks and curbing, hereinabove ordered, shall be paid by the owners of the real estate abutting upon such sidewalks or curbing on the basis of the respective frontage of the property on the sidewalks or curbing to be paved or improved, by ascertaining the entire expense of said improvement, and charging it upon each lot or parcel of real estate in the proportion that its frontage or abutment bears to that of all the abutting lots or parcels of real estate to be improved.

Section V. Be it further ordained, etc., that this ordinance shall take effect from and after its first publication in the official journal of the city. The above ordinance, after having been read section by section, and adopted in a like manner, was adopted as a whole, on final passage by the following vote:

Section 1. Be it ordained by the mayor and board of aldermen of the city of Opelousas, La., that section one of an ordinance of the city of Opelousas, La., entitled "An Ordinance to prohibit the exhibition or performance of street fairs, street carnivals, and so-called tent shows, other than circuses, theatrical stock companies, within the corporate limits of the city of Opelousas, La., and providing penalties for the violation hereof" be and the same is hereby amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Be it ordained by the mayor and board of aldermen of the city of Opelousas, La., that it shall hereafter be unlawful for street fairs, street carnivals, or so-called tent shows, other than circuses or theatrical stock companies to exhibit or perform within the corporate limits of the city of Opelousas, La., provided, however, that such shows may be conducted under the auspices of fraternal or patriotic organizations, upon granting of a permit so to do, by the mayor and board of aldermen of this city.
