INTERESTING ITEMS FROM FRANKLIN WATCHMAN

Sheriff Pecot made two important captures this week. One was Willie Huntley, a negro, who killed his brother in Ascension Parish, more than a year ago, and he has been hunted ever since that time. He was located at Luckland plantation, and the sheriff caught him last Monday. The other one was Samuel Martin, another negro, who attempted to kill several people at Ramos, and fled to Thibodaux. When the officer arrested him, he had a rifle and evidently was ready to shoot at somebody else. Among the country parishes

of Louisiana, St. Mary stands in the fourth place, with a population of 42,135. They are listed as follows: Caddo, 65,425; St. Landry, 53,916; Rapides, 47,168; Cameron has the least of any of the sixty-three, with 4,458. Eight of the parishes decreased in population from 1900 to 1910, and they are Assencion, Bossier, Madison, Plaquemines, Pointe Coupee, Red River, Tensas and West Feliciana.

Office of the Postmaster General, Washington, August 14, 1916.

Because of misleading statements appearing in certain newspapers regarding the status of those postal employees who are now in the military service of the United States, postmasters and all other supervisory officers in the postal service will call to the attention of employees under their supervision, who are now in the military service of the United States, the provisions of Postmaster General's Order no. 9747, of June 26, 1916, and again advise them that every postal employee immediately upon his discharge from the military service will be assigned to the position held by him at the time he left the postal service to enter the military service and that such assignment to duty will be made at his former salary without awaiting the formal approval of the Post Office Department. The Postmaster General desires that not only the postal employees themselves but also that their families understand that the employees are not to suffer the loss of their positions or the salaries that they carry because of having been called into the military service of their country.
