City Council to Call For Bids on Surfacing

Street Committees and City Engineer Proceed Under Instruction From Mayor and City Council.

The meeting of the councilmen of Morgan City at the City Hall last night gave rise to another forward step in city building when Mayor Shannon and the council instructed City Engineer Thorngson and the Street and Landings committee to secure bids on materials for street construction. The first street building probably be done on the Railroad Avenue road connecting the finished Ramos road with the business sections of the city. It is also the plan to make the needed repairs in the street surfaces along the already built stretch leading out to the city cemetery. An advertisement calling for bids for construction material and

surfacing will be published as it is thought that the actual laying of the material will begin in a very short time.

Mayor Shannon is making every effort to give Morgan City the things that the city needs and he has the co-operation of a wide-awake and progressive council. The citizens of the city no doubt stand ready to lend the further assistance that may be needed in securing for their city the improvements to which Morgan City is entitled. It is evident that a determination to do the most important things as they appear to them has possessed the mayor and councilmen and each succeeding meeting of this

municipal body brings forth additional evidence to this end.

It is the opinion of the citizenship that prompt and thorough attention should be given the building of an extension from the end of Railroad Avenue to the complete Ramos road and the pressing need of this as one of the most important strips to be built will probably decide the mayor and council to give this part of the city their immediate attention. However, it is no doubt the intention of the city dads to continue their good work just as rapidly as possible and in the best manner possible until the entire city has an ideal system of streets and roadways.

ST. MARY HELPS OUT IBERIA PAPISH FAIR

At a recent meeting of the Police Jury in St. Mary parish it was decided by the members of that official body that the appropriation of the State which is \$250.00 would be donated to the Teche Fair Association for the conduct and expense of the Fair to be held here the latter part of the month. In other words it will be practically a joint fair. This understanding was brought about by the presence in St. Mary at the meeting of the Police Jury, of Dr. J. A. Goodwin and Secretary Bernard. It is their intention to also interest the good people of St. Martinsville to join with Iberia and St. Mary and have one of the biggest attractions ever held in the state outside of Shreveport. All of the necessary arrangements are now being made for the buildings and floor space and Mr. R. A. Jacob and Secretary Bernard are exceeding busy arranging space for exhibits that are expected. Sheds are to be erected on Weeks, St. Peter and Julia Streets for the accommodation of whatever live stock that is to be brought in from the parish and district and we are told that the entries so far received far exceed expectations. By reason of the interest St. Mary and St. Martin will take in the exhibits, there is no doubt the attendance will be double that of last year. No entrance fee for either admittance or entry is one of the drawing cards and the board of directors knew what they were doing when they decided to make everything free for both exhibitors and visitors.
