LAKE CHARLES TO NEW ORLEANS A ROAD BOOSTERS' TRIP.

Morgan City is urgently requested to be represented in the automobile tour from Houston to New Orleans which is scheduled to pass through Morgan City, Tuesday, September 19th, in a letter from the Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce at Lake Charles, as is published below, the autoists of the Calcasieu city are urging Morgan City to send a good delegation to New Orleans to announce the Old Spanish Trail through Louisiana which will be one of the most traveled highways in the country, covering a route from Houston to New Orleans with the following important cities and towns being on the route: Houston, Liberty, Beaumont, Orange, Vinton, Sulphur, Lake Charles, Welsh, Jennings, Crowley, Lafayette, New Iber-

ria, Franklin, Morgan City, Thibodaux and New Orleans. Morgan City will doubtless arrange for a large delegation of cars to meet the passing visitors and escort them thru the city, and if possible, several of the cars should join the party from Morgan City to complete the trip with them.

The Old Spanish Trail thru Louisiana will be one of the most traveled highways in the country and it is up to us to boost the good roads game and tell the world what we have through this wonderful Gulf Coast country.

Monday, the 18, Leave Lake Charles 6:30 p. m., arrive Welsh, 9:15 a. m., leave Welsh 10 a. m., arrive Jennings 10:30 a. m., Leave Jennings 11: a. m., arrive Crowley, 12 noon for lunch; leave Crowley 2 p. m., arrive Rayne 2:30 p. m., leave Rayne 3 p. m., arrive Lafayette 4 p. m., leave Lafayette 4:30 p. m., arrive New Iberia 7 a. m., and spend the night.

Tuesday, 19th: Leave New Iberia 7 a. m., arrive Franklin 8:15 a. m., leave Franklin 8:45 a. m., arrive Berwick 9:45 a. m., arrive Morgan City 10:30 a. m., leave Morgan City 12 noon; arrive Thibodaux 3:30 p. m., leave Thibodaux 4 p. m., arrive Donaldson 6:30 p. m. and spend the night.

LAID TO REST

Yesterday on the arrival of train No. 7, the remains of Mrs. John Dalton, Sr., were carried to their last resting place in the Catholic Cemetery and laid in one of the vaults of the beautiful Dalton Monument built by Mr. Dalton himself, some years ago.

The funeral took place from the Catholic church which was beautifully illuminated for the occasion, and the impressive ritual of the church was celebrated by Father Souby, who in a few chosen words extolled the life of the deceased, who died a beautiful death, as all good Catholics should, and having received the last rites of the Holy Catholic Church, of which she had been a faithful communicant.
