

**NEGRO PREACHERS IN THE CITY JAIL**

E. W. Collins, Elder, R. W. Clark, preacher, Louis Morgan evangelist and Josh Turner convert, all negro followers of the Triumph Holy Religious Church of God are now in a cell in the city jail awaiting a hearing on charges of disturbing the peace. They were arrested last night at their church in the east end of the city about nine o'clock and placed in confinement to await their hearing which will probably be held before Mayor Shannon this afternoon or Saturday.

A number of shots were fired last night about eight-thirty and an investigation has resulted in showing that the shots were fired by some citizen who felt indignant that the negroes were allowed to hold their services and in an endeavor to impress upon them that their presence and kind of services were unwelcome. It seems that the Triumph Holy Religious Church of God was founded in Morgan City about two months ago by E. W. Collins and after that elder had paid a fine upon landing here in July from New Orleans he was given a permit to conduct his services in accordance with certain ordinances covering such gatherings. Recently complaints have been made to officials as to the manner in which the negroes have been holding services, the claim being advanced that a real disturbance of the peace had ensued. This week which brought the culmination of the meeting was being given over to a revival in which the other evangelists, now in jail with elder Collins were taking a prominent part. The negroes claim that their religion and creed contain nothing but advanced teaching and that they have been endeavoring to lead their followers in the straight and narrow path. The claim that their meetings have been attended by both white and colored and that last night was the first realization they had that their meeting was being regarded as a nuisance and a disturbance of the peace. Witnesses for both sides will probably lay before Mayor Shannon evidence which will permit him to make the wisest disposition of the matter.

**HIGHWAY ENGINEERS NEEDED**

College and university students who specialize in the highway engineering branches of civil engineering courses will find unusual opportunities henceforth of securing early employment and good pay after winning their degrees.

There has long been a decided lack of trained road engineers and the demand for them is increasing rapidly. Probably no other branch in engineering offers such sure reward at this time.

Eighteen state highway commissions out of twenty-four reporting to the National Automobile Chamber of Commerce in New York City state that there is a lack of trained road engineers and sixteen say that preference would be given graduates of college highway engineering courses in the appointment of additional road engineers.

Nearly 1600 engineers are now employed by the twenty-four state commissions and in addition about 2000 are employed as county and city engineers in nineteen states.

Salaries of highway engineers range from \$900 to \$5000 a year. The average is about \$1800.

**CORN**—Forecast 45,700,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate) 45,100,000 bushels.

**OATS**—Forecast, 2,040,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate) 3,900,000 bushels.

**RICE**—Forecast, 14,900,000 bushels production last year (final estimate) 13,714,000 bushels.

**POTATOES**—Forecast 1,820,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate) 1,428,000 bushels.

**SWEET POTATOES**—Forecast 5,910,000 bushels; production last year (final estimate) 5,980,000 bushels.

**COTTON**—Forecast 401,000 bales production last year (census) 341,063 bales.

**HAY**—Preliminary estimate 404,000 tons; production last year (final estimate) 438,000 tons.

**SUGAR CANE**—Condition 90 per cent compared with the ten year average of 87.
