IMPROVEMENT IN LOCAL POSTAL SERVICE

Now that continuous service at the Money Order and Stamp windows in the local postoffice has been inaugurated by Postmaster Hebert, the want of the patrons are being attended to with efficiency and dispatch. No longer is the office jammed and crowded around mail time by both those who are awaiting the distribution of the mail and those who want service at the money order or stamp windows. The latter now receive prompt service and the crowds are kept thinned until now they are not so noticeable as formerly.

This installation of continuous service at the money order and stamp windows has been in view by Postmaster Hebert for a number of months and he has kept constantly behind the matter in his application to the Department at Washington until now he can give the patrons of the Morgan City office this time-saving and agreeable service.
