REPORT OF THE GRAND JURY PROCEEDINGS

True Bills Returned And General Conditions Complimented By Adjourning Body

PUBLIC ROADS

We beg to submit, that during our investigations, we examined a large number of witnesses from all sections of the Parish relative to the condition and the need of public roads.

We find that there is some complaint against the conditions of certain of the dirt roads, notably the road around the Irish Bend, and the road from Ramos to Amelia. We understand however, that the overseer is expecting to start on these roads immediately.

We further beg leave to report, that upon discussing the question of surfacing the roads with gravel or other suitable hard material, we find the sentiment from all sections of the Parish practicable unanimous that the Parish should at once, or as soon as practicable, complete the model surfacing now started, until all roads in the Parish shall have been surfaced, including the Irish Bend, Cypremort, Bayou Sale, Avoca Island, to the Chene, and from Ramos to Catholic Church of Boeuf. We find that this sentiment prevails, even to the extent of voting and levying a special tax, necessary to this end.

We therefore recommend to the Police Jury, as the Governing Body having control over such matters, that steps be taken looking to the immediate and final completion of this work as herein outlined.

RAILROAD CROSSINGS

We find that certain of the railroad crossings in this Parish are not in good condition, especially the crossings over the Frisco and the S. P. tracks, just this side of Sorrel. We advise that the road engineer be instructed to take this matter up with the two roads at once, and see that they are placed in proper condition.

LAW ENFORCEMENT

We find that there are some violations of the Sunday Law, but we could not obtain sufficient information upon which indictment could be returned, except in the case herewith reported. We now call upon the public to give more assistance to the public officials toward the enforcement of this law, than they are at present giving.

We find the laws otherwise enforced in this Parish.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS

We have examined the Court House and Jail Building, and find both of these buildings, as well as the grounds surrounding them, neatly and well kept, and in this connection, wish to commend the jailer for the well kept and sanitary conditions of the jail, and the humane treatment accorded the prisoners.

PUBLIC ACCOUNTS

We have examined the books of the Parish and School Treasurer, and of the Tax Collector, and find their accounts apparently correct, and their books neatly and properly kept.

In conclusion, we wish to thank your Honor and other officials for the many courtesies extended during our services as Grand Jurors.

If a lightning stroke to one of these objects does occur, the mass of metal entering into its composition will usually conduct the current safely to the ground.
