### PIG CLUBS PLAN ANNUAL DISPLAY.

Boys and girls who belong to Pig Clubs of Louisiana have many prizes offered as inducements to exhibit at the State Fair at Shreveport, Nov. 1 to 6. And, besides the awards that are available, they will no doubt find the opportunity to sell their pigs at attractive prices if they so desire. The Boys' Pig Club show has always proven a splendid attraction heretofore, and this year promises not to be an exception.

Realizing the importance of the swine industry, the fair association has set aside a large part of the premium money for distribution among boys and girl farmers engaged in this branch of livestock raising. Altogether about \$1,000 is offered, and in addition there are many specials to be awarded.

The club members will receive free tickets to the grounds upon proper application to Prof. E. S. Richardson, State Boys' Club Agent, Extension Department, L. S. U., Baton Rouge. W. H. Ball, agent in charge of Boys' Pig Clubs, Extension Department, L. S. U., will serve as superintendent of this division, with W. P. Martin, assistant superintendent.

### HORSE RACE CARD AT FAIR, 2 DAYS.

For the benefit of the Louisiana State Fair, Nov. 1 to 6, inclusive, and a particularly interesting feature of the program is that nothing but running events are scheduled. The management realizes that running races please almost everybody, being much more popular than harness events, and on that account all the time and purses this year will be devoted to the running contests.

The meet will be held Thursday and Friday, November 2 and 3. Seven races each afternoon are promised. The purses will range from \$100 to \$250 for each race.

The track here is one of the fastest in the South, and the management is well liked by horsemen. These two facts will help to make the race meet a complete success.

George R. King of Dallas will officiate as superintendent of the horse races.

### FARMER BOYS GET LESSONS AT FAIR.

Juvenile farmers as members of the Boys' Agricultural Extension Clubs, who attend the State Fair and make exhibits will have the privilege again this year of attending the State Fair School for Farmer Boys. All members of clubs for boys, including corn, pig, poultry, agricultural high schools and judging teams, are entitled to participate in the school, which will be conducted by G. E. Nesom, superintendent of livestock extension service, Baton Rouge, assisted by A. L. Roff, poultry expert, also of Baton Rouge.

The boys taking part in this feature of the State Fair will receive daily lectures by experts and specialists in different lines of agricultural development work. The lectures will be delivered in the lecture room. Some will be illustrated. There will also be visits to various exhibits, and other instruction for the boys.

Accommodations in a large tent on the fair grounds will be furnished free of cost to all boys participating in this school feature.
