Any person living in St. Mary Parish may become a contestant.

Any person may nominate another person as a candidate to enter the contest.

Only the number of each contestant or candidate will be published until the close of the contest.

Any person may nominate himself or herself to become a contestant.

When a contestant is once nominated and a number assigned that contestant can not withdraw and turn the votes already entered to his or her credit over to another contestant.
