News Flashes From Near and Far

Popular dissatisfaction with the policy of Chancellor von Bethmann-Hollweg caused deferring sittings of the Reichstag, while members presented the matter at meetings arranged in a number of towns.

It was reported at Athens the new ministry will contain several supporters of former Premier Venizelos.

Rumanians gained ground in Transylvania, but the outcome in Dobrudja was uncertain; by crossing the Danube into Bulgaria, they caused the retirement of the Tutonic forces from Silistra and Turtukai. Violent fighting west of Lutsk and in Galicia was reported.

It was announced that the cabinet of Premier Count Okuma had decided to resign, that the premier would recommend to the emperor the appointment of Viscount Kato.

Roosevelt and Taft met at the Union League Club reception in New York to Charles E. Hughes, but exchanged only formal greetings.

Reticence of the chemist who examined the stomachs of three women found dead at Lancaster, O., led to suspicion of a subtle crime.

A strong protest was made to the United States by Great Britain and France against the action of the Carranza Government in Mexico in seizing the assets of banking institutions in the Mexican capital.

President Wilson departed for Omaha on his invasion of the Middle West, and will deliver an address there Thursday night.

The American committee for Armenian and Syrian relief launched a campaign to raise \$500,000,000 in America for the relief of a starving million scattered through Turkey and Persia.

The interstate Commerce Commission gave the Louisiana Railroad Commission permission to intervene in the cases of the Natchez Chamber of Commerce against the A. L. & G. Roads.

Mississippi Prison Trustees, at a meeting in Jackson, asserted all convicts were needed in harvesting crops on the state farms.

Two loaded street cars dropped thirty feet when a bridge at Cleveland, O., broke and passengers were crushed in the wreckage.

Marked increase in the cost of living was shown in the rising tendency of the prices of foodstuffs on October 1, reports of which were received by the United States Department of Agriculture.

Commander Rowbotham of the Louisiana Naval Militia announced the Secretary of the Navy would send a battleship to New Orleans this winter to give the local command a month's training at sea.

New Orleans was chosen as the 1917 convention city of the American Association of Traveling Passenger Agents and of the National Brewmasters' Association.
