News Flashes From Near and Far

The German Emperor left for the Russian front, where Berlin admits the Germans are being pressed hard although denying Petrograd's claims to a series of Russian victories.

The Cunard liner Franconia, which was being used as a troop ship was sunk by a submarine.

Nine persons including two aged brothers, perished in a fire which destroyed the main building of the Christian Brothers' College in St. Louis.

The Navy Department announced that specifications are in readiness for the four great battle cruisers to be laid down next year.

The Bureau of Crops Estimates did not seem disposed to gloat over its victory over the Southern Rice Growers' Association.

After the war, America must join a league to preserve the peace of the world, President Wilson said in one of his speeches at Omaha.

Otto Granzin, a Los Angeles jeweler, drank poison and leaped into the sea; it was learned he lived many years in New Orleans and several of his children reside in the city.

The South Louisiana Fair was opened with special honors accorded New Orleans.

Announcement was made of the marriage at Santa Barbara, Cal., Sept. 29, of Clark B. Coffey, of Vicksburg, Miss., and Miss Bessie Eyton.

A campaign of education and legislation was urged by the Louisiana Anti-Saloon League, which elected Rev. E. O. Alexandria, president.

A section of the river bank at Natchez, Miss., 100 feet long and six feet wide caved in.

The first disorder out of the milk situation in New York was the storming of a Harlem milk station by women and babes in arms, mostly foreigners, who feared they could not get milk for their children.

Women sympathizers of striking New York carmen fought a pitched battle with the police, clubs and stones being used freely.

Attakapas Medical Meeting

The Attakapas Clinical Medical Society held its quarterly meeting at Crowley, La. There were nearly 40 members present, an excellent program being held the chief attraction. In the afternoon, session was held in the Crowley Sanitarium. This sanitarium has been recently completed and is one of the best outside of New Orleans. The visiting physicians were shown through the place and nothing but praises were heard, especially for the new X Ray Dept. Several interesting cases were shown and discussed. After the meeting, sandwiches and coffee were served in the dining room.

At 6 p. m. the evening session was held in the Elks reception parlors. The following program took place.

Infantile Paralysis by Dr. Butterworth of New Orleans.

Demonstration of blood Transfusion with Sodium Citrate by Dr. H. B. Gessner of New Orleans.

Drug Addiction by Dr. Young of Rayne, La.

Value of Clinical Microscopy in the practice of medicine by Dr. J. W. Faulk of Crowley, La.

All papers were freely discussed by the members of the society. Questions were asked and answered by the lecturers.

After the meeting was over, the society adjourned to meet for its usual banquet at the Egan Hotel. Toasts were made by the invited physicians from New Orleans. The Elks tendered the use of their home, which was accepted until the members departed on the train.

Physicians from the whole Southwest part of the State, formerly called the Attakapas District attended. Morgan City was represented by Dr. De Gravelles and Dr. M. E. Meyer. The next meeting will be held in January in Jennings. Lafayette also wanted the convention there, but withdrew in favor of Jennings as the society has never met there before.
