Personally Conducted Parties

Scenic Trips railroad excursions, trips to Europe, auto drives, all of these are conjured up by the phrase. It remained for Al G. Barnes of the Big Four Ring Wild Animal Circus fame to realize the opportunities of "The personally conducted party" in the circus and install it as a feature of his remarkable system for educating amusing and thrilling the public.

His circus, with its 1,000 animals, 150 trainers, 506 attendants, and the program, made up of animal actors of every kind and specie of wild animals, working with every kind of domestic animal in such a huge affair that the personally conducted party has proven a great innovation.

All school teachers and pupils are met at the main entrance of the Barnes circus tent at 1 p. m. sharp. They are segregated into a party and are taken in charge by a woman, who looks after the comfort of the women and girls. A man does the same for the men and boys. Two uniformed guards escort the party, to see that no child strays away and gets lost in the maze of remarkable things about the circus. A special lecturer guides the party through the animal tent, giving a 40-minute lecture,

guides the party through the animal psychology. The party is then escorted to the School Section, a block of seats reserved for school teachers and children. The five circus acts remain with the party throughout the performance, the lecturer and attendants answering questions about a thousand and one things. Two special caterers stand ready to serve lemonade, peanuts and popcorn.

After the performance the party is escorted by the attendants back into the animal tent to see the animals fed. Following this the attendants see that each one is on cars or autos and off for home.

The feature, tried out as an experiment, was so highly commended by school authorities, and proved generally so satisfactory, that it has become a fixed feature of this most different and modern of circuses.

The Barnes Circus will exhibit in this city on October 10th. A mile-long, six-band parade will mark the morning, starting at 10:30 o'clock sharp. The doors will open at 1 and 7 o'clock p. m. and the performance will begin at 2 and 8 p. m.
