FAMOUS ART CRITIC AND GLOBE TROTTER VISITS MORGAN CITY

Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Dyer are entertaining at their home here Mr. and Mrs. A. Chatain of Chicago. Mr. and Mrs. Chatain are enroute to New Orleans where Mr. Chatain goes to pass on the Delgado Museum Art Collection.

Mr. A. Chatain is a native of France but has been a citizen of the United States for many years. During the past twelve years he has made twenty-six trips to Europe and has visited probably every country of note on the continent. Mr. Chatain and his wife have just returned from a summer's trip to Honolulu and have stopped off here for a surprise visit to Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Dyer and family.

As an art critic, Mr. Chatain is probably without peer in this country. He is credited an expert by the French Government and every famous collection of art in Europe and the United States is familiar to him. His opinion places a collection on its proper plane and a collection which receives his praise and approval is undoubtedly one of high merit.

Mr. Chatain makes a comparison on conditions between the country from which he just returned and his home country and in some instances Honolulu seems to have the edge on the U. S. For instance, he says that sugar cane in that cane grows probably four times as large in stalk diameter as the local cane; that it grows continuously for eighteen months without cutting and that it is 80 per cent richer in saccharine qualities. The climate there is practically the same the year around and the temperature of the waters surrounding the country remains at 73 degrees perennially. The fish in these waters are colored like the rain bow but are insipid to the taste and worthless as food. This insipidity is characteristic of fish, flesh, fowl and vegetables in Honolulu and were it not for the redeeming quality of the pine-apple, which is probably more luscious there than any where else on earth, the edible products of that isle, would perhaps not attempt a man to eat.
