A Greek revolution of serious proportions broke out near Saloniki.

Alfredo Zayas seemed elected president of Cuba by a large majority.

Ceremonies of Oriental splendor attended the consecration of the Japanese crown prince.

After shooting twenty-nine Caranza guards on a train which left Juarez Monday, Villa bandits looted the cars, robbed the passengers and even took clothes from the women.

Villa forces are reported to have captured Parral, in the southern part of Chihuahua.

Fort Vaux, one of the most important fortifications captured by the German crown prince in his drive on Verdun, was evacuated by the Germans. This was admitted by Berlin.

British spies made many attempts to study the submarine Deutschland. Minneapolis millers bought more than a million bushels of Canadian wheat for less than the price of American grain.

Washington considered an informal protest against the use of its title by the American aviation corps of the French army.

About seven thousand elk were fed last winter at Jackson Hole, Wyo., by the Biological Survey.


