EVANGELINE

Bessie Barriscale and Charles Ray soon are co-starred on the Triangle program in a comedy-drama of college life, entitled "Plain Jane," to be seen at the Evangeline theatre tonight.

"Plain Jane," written by C. Gardner Sullivan, is a tale of a little nobody whose goodness and beauty win her a husband, a home and happiness. It concerns the adventure of a slaver in a small New England college town, her innocent flirtation with one of the "college dudes," her winning of a beautiful prize and her eventful capitulation to the wiles of Dan Cupid. Throughout, the piece is abundant with the atmosphere of the campus, which affords a fitting background for the many amusing situations of the story.


