**ORDINANCE No. 90**

To amend and re-enact Section 8 of Ordinance no. 12.

An ordinance imposing a tax upon all Drug Stores, Confectioneries and Cold Drink stands operating within the corporate limits of the Town of Glenmora.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Town Council of the Town of Glenmora legally convened that Section 8 of Ordinance No. 12 of the Town of Glenmora be amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

That there is levied upon all Drug Stores, Confectioneries, Cold Drink stands, a Special tax of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per year.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained etc., that this ordinance shall become effective and tax assessable and collectable January 1st, 1922

**ORDINANCE No. 91**

An ordinance imposing a tax (privilege) upon all carnival shows, dramatic shows, and all vendors of effects connected therewith and imposing said tax upon all ferris wheels, flying jennies (flying horses) and all other tented shows operating within the corporate limits of the Town of Glenmora, Louisiana.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen Town of Glenmora, in session legally convened that there shall be imposed a tax upon all carnivals, dramatic and minstrel shows or any other show operating under tent or canvas not regularly domiciled within the Town of Glenmora as its home, but travelling from town to town within or without the State of Louisiana, as follows:

Sec. 1 A. The tax shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00) per day payable in advance of showing shall be issued for consecutive days, Sunday not included. That in case of carnival shows, the license shall be thirty dollars (\$30.00) per day for 23 tents or concessions and for every concession in addition to 23 a tax of ten dollars (\$10.00) per week per concession shall be assessed.

Minstrels. Minstrels where black faced comedians are employed a tax of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per day shall be assessed payable in advance and shall not be remitted or extended on account of rain.

Flying jennies, water carousals ferris wheels and concessions travelling by themselves shall also be assessed thirty dollars (\$30.00) per day assessable and payable in Section 1-A.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall become effective immediately after its passage.
