No True Bill In Case of Horn

The grand jury, which convened in special session Monday, concluded its labors Wednesday evening and adjourned. The body found five true bills and two no true bills. Among the no true bills found was Tony Horn, murder, and Nevris Lawson, et al., cow-stealing. Horn was arrested in connection with the killing of Dewey Haines of Long Leaf, who was shot while riding in an automobile, with several companions between Forest Hill and Lecompte several weeks ago. The grand jury report, in full, follows:

REPORT OF GRAND JURY
"Alexandria, La., Dec. 13, 1922.
"To the Honorable, the Judge, of the Thirteenth Judicial District Court, Division 'A,' sitting in and for the Parish of Rapides--Greeting:
"We, your grand jurors, duly elected, qualified and sworn and called in special session by order of your honorable court, beg

leave to submit our report.
"We have examined the two cases specially mentioned in your charge to us, as well as five other cases which have been brought to our attention during our present session. We have found five true bills and two no true bills, a list of which we attach to and make a part hereof.
"We have been unable to get sufficient evidence before us to establish a case at the present time against Tony Horn for the murder of Dewey Haines, though we have examined several witnesses and have spared no time and effort in our investigation.
"We have investigated the killing of Peter McDaniels, who was found slain a few days ago. We have examined all the witnesses who apparently would know the facts in the and we are unable to fix the responsibility on any individual, and we therefore pass the same.
"Having completed our labor, we beg leave to file this report and to present the indictments against the parties indicted by this grand jury and ask that we

be discharged, subject to the call of your honorable court."--Town Talk.
