Whereas, the enumeration of
the children of this parish will
show a large increase, and,

Whereas, to teach these chil-
dren necessitates the employment
of a large number of teachers,
and,

Whereas, the needs of the
schools cannot be met with an
appropriation from the Police
Jury of less than three mills as
required by law,

Therefore, be it resolved, that
this Board, now in session, here-
by request and require an appro-
priation of three mills from said
Police Jury as required by law.

directed to take notice of their
apportionment and to carefully

keeping record of the apportion-
ment of funds as they are made.
If the trustees, or others inter-
ested in the different schools,
will keep a record for their own
local needs they will more readi-
ly understand the conditions of
the various schools, and their
funds will not be exhausted unex-
pectedly.

The records of the Parish
School Board are public docu-
ments and any citizen of this
parish has the liberty and privi-
lege of inspecting them, asking
any questions as to any expendi-
tures of any funds which are
handled by this office. Not only
are they at liberty but are re-
quested to keep posted on the
financial conditions of their
schools so that teachers' salaries
and other expenditures can be
regulated accordingly.

There being no further busi-
ness, the Board adjourned to
meet Saturday, July 8, 1911, in
regular meeting.

Ordinance of Town Council.

Franklinton, La., Apr. 4, 1911.

On motion duly seconded, the
following election ordinance was
duly and unanimously adopted,
and ordered promulgated accord-
ing to law, to-wit:

Be it ordained, by the Mayor
and Board of Aldermen, of the
town of Franklinton, that the
Clerk of said Board of Aldermen
shall prepare and cause to be
printed an OFFICIAL ballot to
be used at all general elections
to be held in said town for the
election of officers thereof.

Be it further ordained That
the official ballot heretofore
provided for shall be printed on
white paper of good quality, not
less than 2 1/2 inches in width
and not less than 6 inches in
length.

Be it further ordained: That
any and all persons who expect
to be candidates at any election
to be held in said town, shall be
required to notify the Clerk of
the Board at least ten days be-
fore the date of holding the
said election, and have his name
printed on the official ballot.

Be it further ordained That
no ballot cast at any election held

in town shall be counted by the
Commissioners and Clerks of
said election except the official
ballot, and names not written or
printed thereon shall not be
counted.

Be it further ordained That
any voter desiring to cast his
vote for a person whose name is
not printed on the official ballot
shall have the right to write the
name of the person for whom he
desires to vote on the blank lines
prepared and left on said ballot.

Be it further ordained That
all laws and parts of laws or or-
dinances in conflict herewith
passed by the Mayor and Board
of Aldermen of said town are
hereby repealed.

Be it further ordained That
this ordinance go into effect as
soon as same has been promul-
gated as provided by law.
