Bacon's Essays, a copy of which realized £1,950 at the Huth sale. have a special title to fame. This work was the first of any importance to be translated from English into French. The translation proved a great success. In his preface to the third edition, Baudouin, the translater, complains that "at least four editions of this work would have been sold by now if the booksellers had not hampered its sale by their unwillingness to place it before the public." Still, the fact that three editions were called for within five years shows that the essays were heartily appreciated by French readers. The first French version of Shakespeare appeared in 1776-over 150 years after the translation of Bacon.-London Chronicle.
