School Board Proceedings.

Franklinton, La., Oct. 9.—On the above date the board of directors of the public schools of Washington Parish met in special session as per adjournment with all members present. The meeting was called to order by the president and the minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

On motion duly seconded and carried the clerk of court is hereby authorized and instructed to cancel the bond in favor of the bond on behalf of the First State Bank of Bogalusa, and return bond to said bank. Also, the Tax-Collector is hereby notified that the Washington Bank and Trust Co., of Franklinton, La., has been selected as Fiscal Agent for said bond.

On motion duly seconded and carried the description of school district No. 14 as defined by a resolution of this board passed on the 20th day of February 1914 is hereby amended to read as follows: Be it resolved by the board of directors of public school of Washington Parish, La., that the Bogalusa School District No. 14 be and the same is hereby created and defined as follows: Commencing at the northwest corner of section 3, Tp 3 S, R 13 east, St. Helena Meridian, thence South along the west line of sections 3, 10, 15, 22, and 27 to the southwest corner of section 16, thence south to southwest corner of Wm. Peters headright No. 41, Tp 3-S, R-13-E, St. Helena Meridian, thence east on south line of the Wm. Peters headright No. 41, to Pearl River, thence north up and along said river to the point where ward lines between wards 4 and 5 strike same, thence west along said township line to the northwest corner of section 3 aforesaid, the same being the point of beginning, excepting out of the above all the territory now embraced within the corporate limits of the City of Bogalusa.

On motion duly seconded and

carried the following resolution was adopted.

Whereas, in the opinion of this board it is deemed necessary and advisable to order a special election in school district No. 14 as created and defined by resolution passed Oct. 9, 1914.

Be it resolved by the board of directors of the public schools of Washington Parish, as follows:

Section 1. That special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in school district No. 14 of the Parish of Washington, on Saturday November 21, 1914, at which shall be submitted the following proposition:

Proposition to levy a special tax of six mills on the dollar on all property subject to state taxation in school district No. 14 of Washington Parish, La., annually, for a period of five years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school for said district.

Section 2. That the secretary of this board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots in the following form.

For the Levying of a Tax.

Proposition to levy a six mill special tax on all the property subject to state taxation in School District No. 14 of the Parish of Washington, Louisiana for the period of five years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school for said district.

Notice to Voters—To vote in favor of the proposition submitted on this place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word Yes, and to vote against it place a similar mark in the square after the word No.

And that the Secretary of this board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election all neces-

sary ballot boxes, tally sheets, list of voters, assessed valuation property, and compiled statements of voters in number and amount.

Section 3. That the polling place for said election shall be Bogalusa precinct No. 3, and H. T. Williams, L. H. Bankston and T. J. Adams are appointed commissioners, and J. H. Sutton, clerk of election to serve at Bogalusa precinct No. 14, all of whom shall serve without compensation. And said election shall be conducted under the laws of the state applicable thereto.

Section 4. The president of this board is hereby instructed to give notice of the special election herein ordered, by his proclamation to be published according to law; and in said proclamation he shall announce that at 10 o'clock a. m., Monday the 23rd day of November 1914, this board will meet at their office in the town of Franklinton and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the result as the election.

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to resolution passed by the board of directors of the public schools of Washington Parish, La., at a special meeting held on the 9th day of October 1914, I, F. B. Bateman, president of said board, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in school district No. 14 of said parish of Washington, La., on Saturday the 21st day of November 1914, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, to vote at said election, the following proposition to wit:

To levy a special tax of six mills on the dollar on all property in school district No. 14 of the parish of Washington, La., subject to state taxation, annually, for a period of five years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to public schools for said district.

For the purpose of said special election the polling places will be Bogalusa, precinct No. 3 for special election in school district No. 14, and H. J. Williams, L. H. Bankston and T. J. Adams commissioners and J. H. Sutton, clerk have been appointed to serve at said election to serve at the polling place at Bogalusa. All the aforesaid commissioners and clerks will serve without compensation. At said special election the polls will be open at seven o'clock a. m., and close at five o'clock p. m., and the elections will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at ten o'clock a. m., on Monday the 23rd day of November 1914, the said board of directors of the public schools of Washington Parish La., will meet at their office in the town of Franklinton, and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of said special elections.
