

Ordinance
Franklinton, La., April 6, 1915.
At a regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the town of Franklinton, the following ordinance was proposed and unanimously adopted:
Be it ordained, that on the first day of May, 1915, all dogs whose owners reside within the corporate limits of the town of Franklinton, are required to be muzzled if allowed on the streets.
It is further ordained, that if any dog whose owner resides within the corporate limits of the Town of Franklinton is found on the streets of said Town of Franklinton, without a muzzle, the Marshal is hereby directed to impound said dog and before the said dog can be reclaimed by its owner a payment of \$1 shall be made to the Marshal in order to effect the release of said dog, and after the said dog is impounded and not claimed for a period of three days the Marshal is directed to kill said dog.
Be it further ordained, that any

owner, residing within the corporate limits of the Town of Franklinton, of a dog, allows same to roam the streets without a muzzle, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and conviction thereof, before the Mayor's court shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5 or not more than \$10 or imprisonment for a period of not less than one or more than five days, or both at the discretion of the Mayor.


