Ordinance

Franklinton, La., August 14, 1915, at a regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Franklinton, Louisiana, at which a quorum was present, the following resolution was offered and unannouncedly adopted.
 Be it ordained by the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Franklinton that there be and it is hereby levied a per capita street tax of Three Dollars (\$3.00) on all males residing within corporate limits of the town of Franklinton who are eighteen years old and not over fifty-five years old.

Be it further ordained that said per capita tax shall be delinquent after September 1st 1915.

Be it further ordained that failure to pay said tax shall be deemed a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not more than ten Dollars or work on the streets of said town or Franklinton for no, more than ten days, or both at the discretion of the Mayor.

School Board Proceedings.

Franklinton, La. Aug. 20.—On the above date the board of directors of the public schools of Washington Parish met in special session as per notice with all members present. The meeting was called to order by the president and the first business coming before the board was that of canvassing the returns of the special elections held in Oak Grove, Mt. Hermon and District No. 30.

PROCLAMATION.
 Pursuant to resolutions passed by the board of directors of the public schools of Washington parish, La., at a special meeting held on the 21st y of August 1915, I, F. B. Bateman, president of said board of directors, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolutions, special elections will be held in the following named districts on the 2nd day of October 1915.

1. Mt. Ebal School District No. 31 for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition to-wit. To levy a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all property in school district No. 31 subject to state taxation, annually for a period of five years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school of said district, provided that no taxpayer in district No. 31 shall be required as a result of this election to pay more than five mill special school tax. For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be at Mt. Ebal school and the following commissioners and clerk of election have been appointed to serve

Point School District No. 32 for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition to-wit: To levy a special tax of 10 mills on the dollar on all property in school district No. 32 subject to state taxation, annually for a period of five years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school of said district.

For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be at the Mt. Point school and the following commissioners and clerks of election have been appointed to serve at this election, all of whom shall serve without compensation, S. S. Morris, E. S. Alford, T. I. Bickham, commissioners, and A. W. Robbins, clerk.

3. Isabel School District No. 4 A for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition to-wit: To levy a special tax of four mills on the dollar on all property in school district No. 4A, subject to state taxation, annually, for a period of five years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public schools of said district, provided that no taxpayer in district No. 4A shall be required as a result of this election to pay more than 10 mills special school tax.

For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be at the Isabel school and the following commissioners and clerks have been appointed to serve at this election, all of whom shall serve without compensation: Ellis Magee, John Parker, B. M. Reviere commissioners, and J. R. Schilling, clerk.

4. Spring Hill School District No. 36, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition to-wit. To levy a special tax of four mills on

the dollar on all property in school district No. 36 subject to state taxation, annually, for a period of four years for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school of said district. For the purpose of said special election the polling place will be at the Spring Hill school house and the following commissioners and clerk of election have been appointed to serve at this election, all of whom shall serve without compensation. L. E. Jenkins, W. L. Richardson, and M. M. Magee commissioners, and J. T. Thigpen clerk.

5. Rio School District No. 37, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the constitution and laws of the state of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition to-wit: To levy a special tax of 10 mills on the dollar on all property in school district No. 37, subject to state taxation, annually, for a period of two years, for the purpose of giving additional aid to the public school of said district.
