Charter

THE CITIZENS BANK of Franklinton, Washington Parish, Louisiana.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Washington.

Be It Known and Remembered, That on this the 15th day of July, A. D. 1919, before me, Gordon W. Goodbee, a Notary Public, duly commissioned, sworn and qualified in and for the Parish of Washington, State of Louisiana, and in the presence of the witnesses named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereto subscribed, who declared that availing themselves of the provisions of the laws of the State of Louisiana relative to the organization of the banking business, they have covenanted and agreed and by these presents do covenant and agree, and bind themselves as well as such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them and their successors, to form themselves into and establish a corporation and body politic in law for the objects and purposes and under the agreements and stipulations following, to-wit:

Article I.

This corporation shall be known and designated as, and the business carried on under the name of "THE CITIZENS BANK", and the domicile of said corporation shall be at Franklinton, Washington Parish, Louisiana; under said corporate name it shall have and enjoy succession for the term of ninety-nine years from date hereof unless sooner dissolved by the stockholders in the manner provided by law.

Under said corporate name it shall have, enjoy and exercise all rights, powers and privileges hereinafter set forth, as well as those granted or that may hereafter be granted by law to corporations of this character, with full authority to contract, sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, appear, answer and prosecute in any and all courts of justice and elsewhere, to make and use a corporate seal, to name and appoint such managers and directors to administer its affairs as it may deem necessary and proper, and to make and ordain such by-laws for the proper management of said corporation as may be necessary and proper and consistent with the provision of law and of this charter, and the same to repeal, alter or amend.

All citation or other legal process shall be served upon the President, or

in his absence upon the Cashier of this corporation.

Article II.

The objects and purposes for which this corporation is established, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be:

To establish and conduct a general banking business, with power to receive time and demand deposits, to purchase and discount bills, notes and other evidences of debt, to buy and sell gold and silver coin and bills of exchange, to make and negotiate loans, to lend money on real and personal security or property, to receive for deposit or safe-keeping valuables of every kind; to receive, hold, purchase, acquire and convey, by and under its corporate name, such property real and personal, including bonds, stocks and securities of the United States, or of any State, or of any corporation, board or body, public or private, as may be necessary, proper or convenient to the object of the association, and not in conflict with the laws of this State and the provisions of this charter, and to exercise all the rights of ownership thereto.

Article III.

The capital stock of this corporation is hereby fixed and declared to be the sum of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars, divided into and represented by One Hundred and Fifty (150) shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, said shares to be paid for in cash at the time of issuance.

The names of the stock holders and their place of residence and the number of shares held by each of them, are hereby declared to be as follows:

Alford, Franklinton, La., one share; M. F. Magee, Franklinton, La., twelve shares; and R. D. Magee, Franklinton, La., eight shares.

Transfer of stock to be made only on the books of the corporation in person or by written proxy and under such rules and regulations as the Board of Directors shall prescribe.

Article IV.

All corporate powers of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Directors to be composed of seven stock holders. The Board of Directors may from its members appoint such committees as it may deem proper and vest same with any of its powers to be exercised when the Board is not in session, and subject to any regulations which the Board may impose. The Board of Directors shall prescribe how many of its members constitute a quorum or of any committee thereof, provided that a quorum shall be at least a majority of the members of the Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall have authority to fill any vacancies existing or occurring in their own number or from any other office for any cause whatever, and the person so elected shall serve for the unexpired term of such office.

The first Board of Directors shall consist of R. D. Magee, E. A. Carter, M. C. Pool, J. L. Smith, L. H. Mulina, O. H. Carter and Noel W. Magee, all of whom shall serve until the election hereinafter mentioned, on the second Monday in January, 1920, and annually thereafter an election for seven directors possessing the qualifications required by law shall be held at the domicile of said corporation at its banking house, of which election ten (10) days previous notice shall be given by publication in a weekly news

paper published in Washington Parish, Louisiana, and the persons receiving the majority of the votes cast at said election shall be declared duly elected and installed.

All elections shall be by ballot and shall be held under the supervision of three commissioners to be named by the Board of Directors, each stockholder allowed one vote for each share of stock he owns, and such stock may be either voted in person or by proxy, but no stockholder shall be allowed to vote his or her stock unless the party offering to vote the stock shall have had owned and had registered on the books of the corporation in his or her name for thirty (30) days prior to the day of voting.

If for any reason there shall be no election on the day fixed, it shall be the duty of the President to call an election to be held as soon as possible thereafter, after ten (10) days notice by publication in a weekly newspaper published in Washington Parish, Louisiana. The Board of Directors at its first meeting after its election shall elect, from among its members, a President, and one or more Vice-Presidents, all of whom shall continue in office during the term of the said Board of Directors, and until their successors shall be elected and qualified. The said Board of Directors shall appoint a Cashier and such other officers and employees as it may see fit, and may dismiss all agents and employees so employed, or any of them, at pleasure. The Board of Directors shall have the power to define the duties of all the officers and employees of the bank, fix their compensation, require the necessary bonds, etc.; in fact the said Board of Directors shall have power to do any thing they may deem necessary for the proper management of the bank.

R. D. Magee shall be President and E. A. Carter shall be Vice-President, who shall continue in office until the first annual election.

Article V.

The capital stock of this corporation may be increased or decreased by amendment of this charter, or any article thereof may be modified, amended or changed, at a general meeting of the stockholders held after thirty days notice by publication in a weekly newspaper published in Washington Parish, Louisiana, and a written notice to each stockholder, mailed to his or her last known address, thirty days prior to the holding of the said meeting, and said amendment approved by two-thirds of the amount of the capital stock. All amendments to this charter shall be executed, recorded and published the same as the original charter.

Article VI.

This corporation may be dissolved by a vote of three-fourths of the stock present or represented and voting at a general meeting of the stockholders, convened by the Board of Directors of its own motion or by written request of the majority of the stockholders, after thirty (30) days previous notice by publication in a weekly newspaper published in Washington Parish, Louisiana, and a written notice duly addressed and mailed or delivered to every stockholder of record at his or her last known address.

Upon the dissolution of this corporation by action of the stockholders as aforesaid, its affairs shall be liquidated by three commissioners appointed by a majority of the stock present or represented and voting at such general meeting, said commissioners shall be solvent persons in no wise indebted to the bank, or creditors thereof. The time and number of liquidation, the compensation and powers of the commissioners, and all matters pertaining to the liquidation of the affairs of this corporation may be fixed and determined as the majority of the stock present, or represented and voting, by resolution at such general meeting, may decide.

Whenever this corporation shall be dissolved by limitation, its affairs shall be liquidated by three commissioners appointed by the majority of the stock present or represented and voting at a general meeting of the stockholders convened by the Board of Directors in the manner hereinabove provided, and they shall possess the qualifications hereinabove provided and have such powers as may be conferred upon them.

Article VII.

No stock holder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts or fault of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance due on the shares of stock owned by him, nor shall any mere informality in the organization have the effect of rendering its stockholders to any liability beyond the amount of the unpaid balance due on his stock.

Article VIII.

This corporation may commence business when its entire capital stock consisting of Fifteen Thousand (\$15,000.00) Dollars shall have been subscribed and paid for in cash.
