Proclamation for City Election.

Proclamation for City Election to elect a Mayor Commissioner and two Commissioners as required by Act No. 148 of the acts of the State of Louisiana for the year 1912.

By reason of the authority vested in me by Act No. 148 of the Acts of the State of Louisiana for the year 1912, and the Commission form of government having been adopted by the duly qualified electors at an election held in the City of Natchitoches, La., on the 12th day of Oct. 1912.

Now, therefore, I, W. P. WEMP, Mayor do hereby issue my proclamation calling a special election to be held at the usual polling place in said City on Tuesday the 10th day of December 1912 for the purpose of electing a Commissioner to be Mayor and two Commissioners.

The tickets to read for Mayor Commissioner of the City of Natchitoches La., under Act No. 148 of 1912.

The polls are to be opened at 6 a. m. and closed at 7 p. m. Said election shall be held in the same manner as provided by law in respect to other elections held under the authority of the State pertaining thereto in the holding of Municipal elections.

AN ORDINANCE.

Special Election Ward 8, passed by Police Jury, Oct. 16, 1912.

By Mr. Derbanne:

Whereas there has been filed with this Board and Police Jury petition signed by one fourth of the property tax payers of Ward Eight (8) of this parish eligible to vote at such election praying that a special election be called for the purpose of testing the sense of the voters of the said Ward Eight relative to voting a special Good Roads tax of Five (5) mills on the dollar on all property subject to state taxation for a period of five (5) years for the aid of building, construction and repairing good roads in said Ward Eight.

And whereas this special election is necessary and advisable, therefore be it resolved:

Sec. 1. Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches in regular session convened, that a special election be and it is hereby ordered to be held in Ward Eight of Natchitoches Parish La., on the 26th day of November, 1912, at which shall be submitted the following proposition to-wit:

To levy a special road tax of five mills on the dollar on all property in Ward Eight of the Parish of Natchitoches, subject to state taxation annually, for a period of five years beginning with the year 1913 and ending with the year 1917 for the purpose of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining good roads in said Ward Eight, that said sums realized from said tax, be expended by the police member from said ward with three citizens of the ward to be selected by the member.

Sec. 2. That the secretary of this board and jury be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots, on each of which shall be printed the proposition mentioned in section one of this resolution arranged in such manner as to enable the voters to vote on it and in the following form:

Proposition to levy a five mill special tax on the dollar on all property subject to state taxation in Ward Eight of Natchitoches Parish La., for a period of five years beginning with the year 1913 and ending with the year 1917 for the purpose of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining Good Roads in said Ward Eight, that said sums realized by said tax be expended by the police member from said ward with three citizens of the ward to be selected by the member.

Notice to Voters—To vote in favor of the proposition submitted on this ballot place a cross (X) in the square after the word "Yes" and to vote against the word "No".

At the secretary of this Board be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election all necessary ballots boxes, tally sheets, lists of voters, assessed valuation of property and compiled statement of voters in number and amount.

Sec. 3. That the said special election be held at the regular polling places in said ward, that Steve Wise, Henry Bolton and G. W. Maxey are hereby appointed commissioners of said election and E. P. Kerry clerk of said election at Mora Bay and G. H. Rhodes, Ellis Taylor and Mona Dowden are hereby appointed commissioners of said election at Kisatchie with E. P. Hays as clerk and said election shall be conducted under the laws of the State applicable thereto, commissioners and clerks to serve without compensation.

Sec. 4. That the president of this Jury is hereby instructed to give notice of the special election herein ordered, by his proclamation to be published according to law and in said proclamation he shall announce that at ten o'clock, Tuesday, January 7, 1913, this jury and board will meet at its office in the city of Natchitoches and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of the election.

Sec. 5. That this resolution shall in no wise interfere with the present road laws relative to appointment of overseers and apportioners who shall continue to act in accordance with the law. Carried unanimously.

CHARTER.

BANK OF MARTHAVILLE.

State of Louisiana, Parish of Natchitoches.

Be it known, That this day before me, J. E. Selby, Notary Public, in and for said parish, duly commissioned and sworn, came and appeared the undersigned persons, who declared, that availing themselves of the laws of the State of Louisiana, relating to the organization of Banking Corporations, they organize into a body corporate and declare the following to be their charter, to-wit:

ARTICLE ONE. The name of this corporation shall be Bank of Marthaville, with its domicile at Marthaville, Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana. Under said corporate name it shall have the right to make and use a corporate seal, with such inscription thereon as it may deem proper, and the same to change or alter at will.

ARTICLE TWO. This corporation is organized for the purpose of carrying on the general business of banking, and it shall have full power to do all things granted by law to corporations of such character.

ARTICLE THREE. The authorized capital stock of this corporation shall be Fifteen Thousand Dollars, divided into three hundred shares of Fifty Dollars each, said stock to be issued at not less than par value and paid for in cash.

The capital stock may be increased or the number and amount of shares may be changed by a two-thirds vote of stock, in amount, at a meeting of the stockholders held for that purpose after thirty days notice by publication and thirty days written notice mailed to each stockholder.

ARTICLE FOUR. This corporation shall begin business on February 1st, 1913, and shall endure for a period of ninety-nine years from this date.

ARTICLE FIVE. The affairs of this corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors, elected by the stockholders at an annual meeting held for that purpose on the second Tuesday of February of each year, each share of stock entitling the holder thereof to one vote.

The officers of this corporation shall be a President, 1st Vice-President and 2nd Vice-President, to be elected annually by the Board of Directors, and the first officers shall be A. B. Ives, Pres., A. A. Hammond, 1st Vice-president and C. G. Pattison, 2nd Vice-president. The 2nd, Vice-president (and in his absence the President) shall be the proper person upon whom citations notices and all legal processes shall be served.

ARTICLE SIX. The officers of this corporation shall be a President, 1st Vice-President and 2nd Vice-President, to be elected annually by the Board of Directors, and the first officers shall be A. B. Ives, Pres., A. A. Hammond, 1st Vice-president and C. G. Pattison, 2nd Vice-president. The 2nd, Vice-president (and in his absence the President) shall be the proper person upon whom citations notices and all legal processes shall be served.

ARTICLE SEVEN. This corporation shall be liquidated at or before the end of its term by three commissioners chosen by a two thirds vote, in amount, of the stock at a special meeting of the stockholders called for that purpose after thirty days notice by publication in a newspaper published in Natchitoches Parish and after thirty days written notices mailed to each stockholder. In either case the commissioners elected as above shall have all power necessary for the liquidation.
