By Mr. Cockerham:

Whereas there has been filed with this Board and Police Jury a petition signed by one third of the property tax payers of ward four (4) of Natchitoches parish, Louisiana, eligible and qualified to vote at such election, praying that a special election be called and held in said ward for the purpose of testing the senses of the voters of said ward relative to voting a special public road and bridge tax of five mills on the dollar on all property situated in said ward subject to State Taxation for a period of five years for the aid of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining public roads and bridges in said ward 4 of Natchitoches parish, La.

And whereas this special election is necessary and advisable therefore be it resolved:

Sec. 1. Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, in legal and regular session convened that a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in ward 4 of Natchitoches parish, State of Louisiana, on the 25th day of February, 1913, at which shall be submitted to the property tax payers of said ward, eligible and qualified to vote in said election under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana the following proposition:

To levy a five (5) mill special tax on the dollar on all property subject to State taxation in Ward Four of Natchitoches Parish Louisiana for a period of five years, ending with the year 1917 for the purpose of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining public roads and bridges in said ward 4 of Natchitoches parish, Louisiana.

Sec. 2. That the secretary of the Police Jury of the parish of Natchitoches be and he is hereby entrusted to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots on each of which shall be printed the proposition mentioned and set forth in session one (1) of this resolution in such forms as to enable the voters to vote in favor or against the proposition submitted. Ballots to be used at such election shall be in the following form:

For the levying of a tax	
Proposition to levy a five mill special tax on the dollar on all property subject to State taxation in ward four (4) of Natchitoches parish, Louisiana for a period of five years beginning with the year 1913 and ending with the year 1917 for the purpose of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining public roads and bridges in said ward 4, Natchitoches parish, Louisiana	YES

Notice to Voters. To vote in favor of the proposition submitted upon this ballot place a cross (X) mark in the square after the word "yes" to vote against it place a similar mark after the word "no".

And the Secretary of this Board and Police Jury be and he is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election all necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, lists of voters, assessed valuation of property in number and amounts.

Sec. 3. That the said special election be held at the regular polling in said ward 4, shall be those now established by law in said ward 4 of Natchitoches parish, Louisiana, namely Camp and Clarence, and that Frank Gallespie, Geo. Gillian and Selme Trichel are hereby appointed commissioners and Geo. Prothro Clerk of Election to serve at Camp and W. A. Airey and A. B. Lestage and W. A. Ragan are hereby appointed commissioners and Arnold Sompayrac, Clerk of Election at Clarence, all of whom shall serve without compensation, and said election shall be conducted under the laws of the State of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Sec. 4. That the President of the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches is hereby instructed to give notice of the special election herein ordered by his proclamation to be published according to law and in said proclamation he shall announce that at 10 o'clock a. m. on the 7th day of April, 1913, this Police Jury will meet at its usual meeting place in the Court House in the town of Natchitoches, La., and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvas the returns and declare the result of said special election.

That the Board of Supervisors

of the parish of Natchitoches, are hereby requested to appoint the commissioners and Clerks and to procure the tickets to be voted.

That said election shall be held under the laws of the State applicable thereto and the polling places shall be as they are now fixed by law in the Court House, precincts one and two.

Notice is hereby given that this Police Jury will meet in its office in the Court House of the parish of Natchitoches in the town of Natchitoches at ten o'clock Monday April 7th 1913 and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvas the returns, and declare the result of said special election.

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Police Jury of the parish Natchitoches Louisiana at its regular session held on the 10th day of January 1913, I, G. H. Pierson president of the Police Jury hereby give notice, that in compliance with said resolution a special election will be held in Ward Four (4) of the parish of Natchitoches Louisiana on the 25th day of February 1913 for the purpose of submitting to the property tax-payers qualified under the law and Constitution of Louisiana to vote at such election, the following proposition:

To levy a five (5) mill special tax on the dollar on all property subject to State taxation in Ward Four of Natchitoches Parish Louisiana for a period of five years, ending with the year 1917 for the purpose of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining public roads and bridges in said Ward Four Natchitoches Parish Louisiana.

For the purpose of said special election the polling places shall be at the regular ones in said ward namely, Camp and Clarence, La. and at the Camp precinct the following shall be the officers of the said election, Commissioners; Frank Gallespie, George Gillian, and Selme Trichel, with George Prothro as clerk, and at Clarence the commissioners shall be W. H. Airey, A. B. Lestage, and W. A. Ragan with Arnold Sompayrac as clerk of said election, all of whom shall serve without compensation at said election. The polls will be open and close at the hours designated by law and the election shall be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that said Police Jury of the parish of Natchitoches Louisiana will meet at its office in the Court House in the city and parish of Natchitoches Louisiana and in open session on the 7th day (Monday) April 1913 proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvas the returns and declare the result of said special election.

PROCLAMATION.

Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Police Jury of the parish of Natchitoches Louisiana at its regular session held on the 10th day of January 1913, I, G. H. Pierson president of said Police Jury hereby give notice that in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in Ward One (1) of the parish of Natchitoches La., on the 25th day of February (Tuesday) 1913 for the purpose of submitting to the property tax payers qualified under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at such election the following proposition:

To levy a five mill tax on the dollar on all property subject to state taxation in said ward one for a period of ten years in aid of The Orange North East Railroad Co., or for such length of time as will net the sum of sixty five thousand and six hundred dollars, in accordance with the said resolution, and subject to its provisions to be voted at said election on 25th day of February 1913 and end with Dec 1922.

That said Company shall make the City of Natchitoches, La., a permanent Point of said Railroad and shall purchase 20 acres of land in or adjoining said City of Natchitoches, La., and erect thereon yards and rooming houses and other necessary appurtenances for a division point, and

Provided further that said Railroad Company shall commence the construction of said railroad on or before May 31st 1913 at a point not exceeding two miles from the City of Natchitoches La., and shall complete said road and operate trains thereon by Jan 1st 1916 and in event said tax is voted and the condition hereof complied with by the Railroad Company, the Police Jury shall levy and collect annually commencing in the year 1916 according to law said tax on all taxable property in said Ward one.

Sec. 4. That at said election only legally qualified tax payers entitled to vote, under the laws of the State shall be permitted, and participate and vote at said election.

Sec. 5. That the Board of Supervisors of the Parish are hereby requested to appoint Commissioners to hold said election and to procure the tickets to be voted.

Sec. 6. That the result of said election shall be proclaimed and due proclamation be made according to law.

Sec. 7. That publication of the petition and this ordinance be duly recorded according to law. Carried unanimously.
