## CHARTER.

State of Louisiana  
Parish of Natchitoches  
Personally came and appeared before me the undersigned authority, the several persons whose names are subscribed hereto, who declared that availing themselves of the laws of this State they do hereby form and organize themselves into a Limited Corporation for the purpose of establishing and operating a bakery in the City and parish of Natchitoches, La., and they adopt the following Articles for the government of said corporation:

### ART. I.

The name of this corporation shall be "THE PEOPLES BREAD COMPANY, LTD." Its domicile shall be the City of Natchitoches, La. It shall exist for Nine-Nine Years unless sooner dissolved. Legal process shall be served on the president and in his absence on the Vice President. Under its corporate name it shall have power to contract, sue and be sued, acquire by purchase or otherwise real and personal property and to sell, mortgage or otherwise hypothecate same, and to establish and operate in the City of Natchitoches, La., and elsewhere in the State of Louisiana, a bakery and to manufacture and sell bread, cakes, crackers, etc., etc. To employ such persons necessary to the conduct of its business and to do and perform all acts and things necessary and essential to the management and conduct of its business.

### ART. II.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be Ten Thousand Dollars, divided into 1000 shares of TEN DOLLARS each, which shall be paid in cash at such times as the Board of Directors of the Co. may direct. No transfer of stock shall be valid unless entered upon the books of the Company and on the certificate of the certificate.

### ART. III.

The corporate powers shall be vested in a Board of Directors of Five stockholders who shall be elected on the 1st Monday in November 1914 and annually thereafter. The Directors shall elect one of their own members as President, Vice-President and Secretary-Treasurer. The first Board of Directors shall be Sam Caspari, J. J. Neilson, Jr., Antonio Michael, Sam Dipaola and M. E. Prudhomme of whom Sam Caspari shall be President; Antonio Michael Vice-President; and J. J. Neilson Jr., Secretary-Treasurer. This Board shall serve until the next election in November 1914 or until their successors are elected and qualified. Any vacancy in the Board of Directors shall be filled for the unexpired term by the remaining Directors. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

### ART. IV.

This charter may be amended or the corporation dissolved at a general meeting of the stockholders convened for that purpose, with the assent of 2-3 of the entire capital stock. Provided TEN days written notice is given to each stockholder of such meeting and notice published in a local weekly paper for two insertions. In event of dissolution the affairs of the Company shall be liquidated by three commissioners elected by the stockholders. Any vacancy shall be filled by the remaining commissioners.

### ART. V.

No stockholder shall ever be held liable for the contracts or debts of the corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance of the shares subscribed by him. Nor shall any informality in organizing have the effect of rendering this charter null or exposing a stockholder to any liability beyond the amount of his subscription.

### ART. VI.

The annexed subscription list to the capital stock of the corporation is attached to and made part hereof and this corporation is declared to be a going concern and entitled to commence business immediately. Done and signed in the presence of the undersigned competent witnesses and me Notary Public in the City of Natchitoches, La., on this 23rd day of October 1913.

## An Ordinance.

By Mr. Kile:  
Whereas it is shown that the Water & Light Plant is being operated at a loss and in order to maintain the same and procure necessary repairs and repair and put in order that now in use, we find it imperative to change and readjust our water rates and thoroughly reassess the same. Be it therefore ordained by the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Natchitoches:

Sec. 1. That all old rates are set aside and annulled, and that the following rates for water are hereby fixed and established as water rates for the city and consumers of water, and the collector is hereby ordered and empowered to collect the same as herein fixed as follows:  
Sec. 2. The minimum meter rate for water shall be seventy cents (.70) per month, and no less rate shall be given.  
From 1 to 15,000 gallons per month 35c per m. gallons.  
From 15,000 gallons to 30,000 per month 30c per m. gallons.  
From 30,000 gallons to 90,000 per month 25c per m. gallons.  
From 90,000 gallons to 150,000 per month 20c per m. gallons.  
From 150,000 gallons to 300,000 per month 15c per m. gallons.  
From 300,000 gallons to 600,000 per month 10c per m. gallons.  
Over 600,000 special rates will be given.

Sec. 3. That all water shall be paid for monthly at the office of the collector on or before the 15th day of succeeding month in which same is due and on failure to pay on or before said date service will be discontinued and water cut off.

Sec. 4. That all persons taking city water are required to sign and execute new contract before Jan. 1st, 1914 to conform to new rates and that all customers, (except those who have only one faucet or outlet on outside of building and they shall pay 70c per month, and water is then to be used only for domestic purposes) shall be required to take water through meter the meter to be used to be approved by the City Commissioners through their officers, and installed under their supervision: The meter boxes and connections shall be purchased by the customer, but shall be installed and maintained free of cost by the city. And all meters shall be installed in accessible place, so that same can be easily reached and read by meter reader, and placed in meter box and approved by Commissioners and meter boxes and connections shall be furnished to customers by city at actual cost, but customer shall pay in cash for same.

Sec. 5. Customers shall pay monthly instead of quarterly. And all of the rates fixed herein shall go into effect on Jan. 1st, 1914 and all meters shall be purchased and installed by first of April, 1914; otherwise service will be discontinued. All applications for meters, boxes and applications for water shall be made at the Mayor's office as per terms of this ordinance and all other ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Sec. 6. Be it further ordained that the light rates shall stand as they now are.
