

To the Hon. Police Jury in and for the parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana.

We the undersigned property tax payers of Road District No. 3, ward ten, of the parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, qualified to vote in an election, respectfully petition your Hon. body to call an election at which election shall be submitted to the property tax payers of said Road District No. 3, ward ten, in such election to vote in such election in such district under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, the question and proposition of voting and levying for a period of five years beginning with the year 1914, and including the years 1915, 1916, 1917 and 1918, a special five mill tax on all property situated in said Road District No. 3, ward ten, subject to taxation for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and repairing public roads and bridges in said Road District No. 3, ward ten, of the parish of Natchitoches, La., said election to be called and held in accordance with the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana relative to such special election.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, Sec. 1. That in accordance with a petition of the citizens from Road District No. 3, ward ten, parish of Natchitoches, a special election is hereby held in said Road District No. 3, ward ten of the parish of Natchitoches on 15th day of Feb. 1914, at which shall be submitted to the property tax payers of said Road District No. 3, eligible and qualified to vote at such elections the following proposition: To levy a tax of five mills on the dollar on all the assessable property in said Road District No. 3 of the parish of Natchitoches, ward ten embracing the following property:

All that portion of ward ten beginning at the north west corner of section six, township 6, range 6, Natchitoches parish Louisiana, thence run east on the range line to the eastern line of Texas and Pacific Railway right of way, thence in a south easterly direction along the said eastern line of the said Texas and Pacific right of way to the boundary line between the parishes of Natchitoches and Rapides, thence in a south westerly direction along the boundary line dividing the parish of Natchitoches and Rapides to the intersection of said boundary line and the ward line between line eight and ten, thence west, with said boundary line between said wards to the south west corner of section 31, T 6, N R 6, W, thence north along the line dividing ward seven and ten to the place of beginning, said territory comprising Road District No. 3, Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana.

The said special tax to exist for a period of five years beginning and including the year 1918, the said tax to be solely devoted to construction and maintenance of the roads and bridges in the District No. 3, of Natchitoches Parish, that the secretary of the Police Jury is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at the said special election a sufficient number of ballots on which shall be printed the proposition submitted and set forth in section one of this ordinance in the following form, viz:

Proposition to levy a 5 mill special tax on the dollar on all assessable property in said District No. 3, of ward ten, Parish of Natchitoches as above described for the purpose of constructing and maintaining, from the year 1914 including the year 1918.

Notice to Voters: To vote in favor of said proposition place a cross (X) in the square under the word YES. To vote against the said proposition place a similar mark under the word NO.

Sec. 3. The secretary is instructed to have prepared for use all of the necessary ballots, ballot boxes, tally sheets and list of voters, assessed valuation of property and compiled statement in number and amount.

Sec. 4. That said special election be held in accordance with the laws of the State and at the polling precinct No. 1 at Cloutierville and No. 2 at Chopin, Natchitoches parish, La.

The following are named and appointed commissioners and clerk to serve at said election: At Cloutierville, Eugene Kerry, Wm. Bell and Adolph Gallion, Commissioners, and W. H. Russell, Clerk. And at Chopin J. M. Johnson, John Spurgeon and Lee Sharp, Commissioners, Adam Carnahan, Clerk.

Sec. 5. That the president of the Police Jury is hereby instructed to issue his proclamation giving notice of said special election herein ordered and that the Police Jury will meet at its regular meeting place on the 1st Monday in April in the parish of Natchitoches, city of Natchitoches and open and count the ballots in number and amount and declare the result of election.

Yeas, Messrs. Pierson, Adams, Cockerham, Knott, Parker, Derbanne and Russell, Nays, none. Carried.
