Proceedings Police Jury.

That the following petition of citizens of ward nine be accepted:

To the Hon. President and members of the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches.

We the undersigned residents and taxpayers respectfully petition your body as follows:

To create a road district as follows: Commencing at a point on Cane River, section line 108 and 109 running in an easterly direction along the dividing line between the above numbered sections to eastern boundary of township 8, R 6 W, thence directly north on township line to Red River, thence up Red River on west bank to ward line between ward one and nine thence in a westerly direction to Cane River along the said line dividing ward one and nine, thence down east bank of Cane River to starting point.

We further respectfully petition your body to call an election for the purpose of assessing the ward nine people living in said road district as early as possible, upon the question of voting a five mill tax for a period of five years for the purpose of building, constructing, repairing and maintaining good roads in said district. The said tax in event of the election being carried to be assessed against all property, real and personal in said district for the purpose above stated. The tax to be assessed for the years 1915, 1916, 1917, 1918 and 1919.

We the undersigned property tax payers of ward nine of your parish respectfully pray that you establish the following portion of ward nine into a road district to be known as road district No. 11, commencing at the point on the ward line between ward one and nine where the southwest boundary line of section 38, T 8, R 7, crosses said ward line thence south easterly to Bayou Natchez at its junction with the southwest boundary line of section 38, T 8, R 7, crosses said ward line thence south easterly to the southern boundary line of section 59, T 8, R 7, thence east along said line to its intersection with the western boundary of section 25, T 8, R 7, thence south to the line between sections 25 and 34, thence on the line between the property of J. Alphonse Prudhomme and Carroll Jones to the west bank of Cane River, thence up the west bank of Cane River to the ward line thence along the north line of ward line to point of beginning.

We further petition your Hon. body to call a special election of the property tax payers of said district entitled to vote on the proposition of levying a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all property in said district liable to taxation, for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public roads and bridges in said road district. To levy a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all the assessable property real and personal in Road District No. 11 of the Parish of Natchitoches, embracing and including the following territory: Commencing at a point on Cane River, section line 108 and 109 running in an easterly direction along the dividing line between the above numbered sections to eastern boundary of township 8, R 6 W, thence directly north on township line to Red River, thence up Red River on west bank to ward line between ward one and nine thence in a westerly direction to Cane River along the said line dividing ward one and nine, thence down east bank of Cane River to starting point. Alphonse Prudhomme and Carroll Jones to the West bank of Cane River, thence up the West bank of Cane River to the Ward line thence along the North line of Ward Nine to point of beginning.
