An Ordinance.

By Mr. Kile, Seconded by Mr. Boydston.
Be it ordained by the Mayor and Commissioners of the City of Natchitoches:
Section 1. That a graduated License Tax for the year 1916, as is specially allowed and levied by the State of Louisiana, under authority of the Acts of the General Assembly of La., fixing and levying license taxes, on all occupations, trades, professions, firms and corporations, or associations, and on which the State levies and collects a license tax, is hereby levied, fixed and assessed on and against all persons, callings, trades, occupation, firms, business, corporations by the City of Natchitoches for the year 1916, and the same graduation of said license is hereby made, graduated and fixed as is graduated made and fixed by the State of La.
Section 2. Be it further ordained: That said license tax for the year 1916, is hereby levied and fixed against all of said persons, trades, callings, occupations, business, firms, corporations, associations, etc., within the limits of the City of Natchitoches in the same amount as is fixed and levied by the State of La. and by the Parish of Natchitoches for Parochial purposes; and are to be used for street purposes.
Section 3. Be it further ordained, that same as fixed and levied, shall be collected by the City Tax Collector under the same rules and within the time and manner, and under the same penalties, and under the same penalties, and costs, as is fixed and allowed by the State of Louisiana and Parish of Natchitoches for the collection of State and Parochial licenses, and the said City Tax Collector is hereby authorized to grant and issue licenses in the name of the City of Natchitoches, upon the payment to him of the amount due in cash, by said person, firm, corporation or association.
Section 4. Be it further ordained: That the said Tax Collector shall turn over to the City Treasurer by the 10th of each month, all of the monies collected by him for City Licenses during said year to said dates.
Section 5. Be it further ordained, that the license for each Fire Insurance Co. is hereby specially fixed at the sum of Ten Dollars for the year.
Section 6. That all licenses not paid by the 1st day of March 1916, shall be deemed due and delinquent and on the 1st day of March shall be turned over to the City Atty, for collection and the same shall be at once collected by said City Atty, in the form and manner and under and with same penalties as prescribed by the State Laws.

CHARTER.

State of Louisiana
Parish of Natchitoches.

Before me, the undersigned authority, personally came and appeared the persons whose names are hereunto subscribed, who declared that they do hereby form a corporation with the following articles as the charter and also the original subscription list therefor.

ARTICLE I.

Its name shall be "PROGRESSIVE MUTUAL BUILDING AND LOAN ASSOCIATION", and its domicile Natchitoches, Natchitoches Parish, Louisiana.
Citation shall be served on its President or, in his absence from the parish, on its Secretary.
It shall begin business immediately and exist for a period of ninety-nine years.

ARTICLE II.

Its purpose is to assist its members in purchasing, building, improving and repairing real estate and homesteads and removing incumbrances therefrom and to loan money to its members.
The nature of its business shall be a general "building and loan" or "homestead" business.

ARTICLE III.

It shall have a capital stock of one million dollars divided into ten thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, namely: two thousand shares of "Paid-up-Stock" and eight thousand shares of "Installment Stock".
"Installment Stock" shall be sold for an initial payment, payable at the time of subscription, not less than a sum equal to sixty cents per month share for each month since the beginning of its series and a monthly payment of sixty cents per share, payable on the first day of each month thereafter, until such payments, plus the share's part of dividends, amount to one hundred dollars.
"Paid-up-Stock" shall be sold for cash, at not less than par, payable at the time of subscription.
All stock shall be issued in series dated the first of March or the first of September of the year issued.

ARTICLE IV.

Its powers shall be vested in, and its affairs conducted by, a board of nine directors elected by ballot by the stockholders at a meeting to be held on the first Tuesday in March of each year beginning with 1917.
Vacancies on the board shall be filled until the next stockholders meeting by the remaining directors.
The board shall elect, Viva Voce, the following officers from its members, to wit: A President, a Vice-President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, the same individual may be elected both Secretary and Treasurer.
The first board shall consist of Sidney Kaffie, who shall be President, Samuel Levy, who shall be Vice-President, T. G. Barnes, who shall be Secretary and Treasurer, Arthur W. Watson, Samuel H. Hill, Robert J. Phillips, Albert E. Ewing, M. H. Carver, and C. K. Payne.

ARTICLE V.

At stockholders meetings, each person who has been a member for sixty days preceding the meeting shall be entitled to one vote for each full dollar paid by him on the purchase price of stock.

ARTICLE VI.

Meetings of stockholders for purposes for which the law prescribes a special notice, shall be upon the notice so prescribed. Notice of meetings for other purposes shall be given by publication once, not less than ten nor more than twenty days before the meeting, in a newspaper published weekly at Natchitoches, Louisiana.

ARTICLE VII.

Its net earnings shall be ascertained semi-annually on the first days of March and September, each year, and from such earnings the board of directors may declare dividends.
Dividends shall be apportioned according to payments made on stock subscriptions exclusive of premiums.

ARTICLE VIII.

Unpaid installments and other charges upon shares of stock shall be a lien thereon enforceable by suit or by forfeiture as may be determined by the board of directors.

ARTICLE IX.

When this corporation is dissolved its affairs shall be liquidated by three Liquidators elected by ballot by the stockholders at a meeting called for that purpose. In case of vacancies amongst said liquidators such vacancies shall be filled by those remaining.
The Liquidators shall convert the assets of the corporations into cash by collection or sale thereof and shall distribute the proceeds, after paying costs, first to the creditors of the corporation and the remainder to the stockholders.
Said Liquidators may, and on the demand of one-fourth in amount of the stockholders shall obtain confirmation as Judicial Liquidators from the District Court of the corporation's domicile and shall conduct the liquidations under the orders of said court, giving bond in such amount as may be fixed by the stockholders or by said court.
Thus done and signed by said appraisers all residents of Natchitoches Parish Louisiana, who severally subscribe for the number and kinds of shares indicated opposite their respective names, in the presence of the two undersigned witnesses in said State and Parish on this Twenty Fifth day of January, 1916.


