Russell and proxy for M. Barron, U. P. Breazeale and proxy for R. J. Pullin, Valsin Lambre, Henry Russell.

The purpose of the meeting having been explained by the Chairman, to be to select delegates to the State Convention at Baton Rouge, the following resolution was offered:

Resolved further, That said delegates are hereby instructed to vote as a unit on all questions as a majority of those present at said convention may determine. No proxies to be allowed. Unanimously adopted.

The following resolution was then offered:

Resolved, That we, the Democratic Executive Committee of the Parish of Natchitoches, do hereby endorse the administration of President Woodrow Wilson, and point with pride and satisfaction to the achievements of the Democratic Party under the leadership of that great President; specially among which is the enactment in the law, a financial system, through the Federal Reserve Bank, thereby placing in the hands of the Government the control of the issuance of money, to meet the needs of the business and agricultural interests as against the Republican idea of control through National Banks; the election of United States Senators by popular vote, as against the convention system; we endorse President Wilson's Foreign Policy of "Peace with Honor," with "jealous care of the integrity of the Nation; we endorse the bill now pending before Congress known as the "Rural Credit System" act, which is in the interests of the agricultural interests of the country, and urge our Senators and Representatives in Congress to give it their earnest support.

We endorse the Platform of principles, and policies of the State Democratic Party as enunciated in the platform adopted by the State Democratic Executive Committee, and advocated by Hon. Rufin G. Pleasant, the Democratic Candidate for Governor. That we urge and instruct our representatives in the Legislature, both Senator and representatives to support such measures as will enact into law those principles, and specially as to "Better Public Highways." The abolition of the Fee system and placing all Officials on a salary basis; and to oppose any extension of the appointive power of the Governor, as is covered by the "Short Ballot System."

We send greetings to our fellow Democrats of the State and assure them that we have not forgotten the trying days of Republicanism and Reconstruction period, and will on April 18th, reaffirm our faith in the Democratic party, by Stamping the Rooster.

Unanimously adopted. There being no further business the Committee adjourned.
