News from the Capital.

Editor Enterprise:

To date, with a wide-spread intention everywhere among the Legislators to wait for the development of the party principles which will come this week from the meeting of the State Convention and the presentation of the new Governor's first official message, the General Assembly has done little more than organize and prepare itself for a busy and, if indications can be trusted, fruitful session.

Not in the recollection of the oldest follower of legislative affairs, have so many matters of importance to the State been before the members of the Legislature for solution as now await them. Attention to the broken-down financial system of the State, adjustment of the revenue and taxation laws, appropriations for the needy State institutions and last but not least, the re-adjustment of the election laws, are the most important issues which will have to be handled. But it should be said to the credit of the Legislature, at this stage, that it seems to be alive to the importance of its duties and apparently is going to go at its work carefully and conservatively.

The Legislature, both the Senate and the House, has gone at its work of organizing effectively. In the Senate, the Committee appointment brought Senator Cunningham on three of the most important committees. To many of the older Senators who had long associated Natchitoches and her representatives as meaning Captain Caspari with his outspoken loyalty to the Normal School, Senator Cunningham who had been in the extra session of the last administration, filling an unexpired term, was very much of a newcomer. But at that, the Senator is the dean of the Natchitoches representation and his is the only old face here. In the House, occupying the same seats that her Representatives have had in the past, Messrs. Breazeale, Kille and Cox have gotten settled and ready for work. All three men drew good Committee assignments and all will be active in the House work. The notice of the Constitution amendment to be offered by Mr. Breazeale, providing for an income tax similar to that of the Federal Government, and of that of Mr. Kelly providing that Sheriffs, Clerks and Assessors shall serve not more than two consecutive terms, has caused considerable comment, mostly favorable as being desirable legislation.

The house appropriation committee having gone on record as favoring a curtailment of expenditures to fit in with the revenues of the State, means that the Natchitoches delegation, with the enormous interests of the Normal School to be protected, will have its hands full, taking care of the needs of this institution. But the Normal School has many graduates and more friends in the Legislature and the home crowd will have both able and willing allies.

The meeting of the State Democratic Convention Tuesday will develop in the open the general policies of the party and administration which this legislature will have to take care of and next week should make it possible to give more definite and interesting capital news.


