Louis Symphony Orchestra.





Mr. Delleonno is a composer as well as an expert bassoon player. The couple are very devoted and always take joint engagements. They have played in all the leading grand orchestra orchestras in Europe and America, as well as in Cairo, Egypt, and Buenos Ayres, Argentina. They came to St. Louis to join the Symphony Orchestra after several years with the Boston Opera.

Mme. Delleonno owns two harps, each costing more than \$1,000.00. One is of Italian make and the other is a "made-in-America" instrument, from Lyon and Healy, Chicago. She prefers this harp and uses it always with the orchestra. The other she keeps for home use and practice. She says American harps are better than those made in Europe.

Delleonno is extremely fond of pets and has a number of dogs, cats and canary birds. PROCLAMATION

Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, at its regular meeting held on the 2nd day of April 1917, I, Edgar Levy, President of said Parish Board of School Directors, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said resolution, a

special election will be held in Goldonna School District in the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, on the 4th day of May 1917, for the purpose of submitting to the property tax payers qualified under the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election, the following proposition, to wit: To levy a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all the property in Goldonna School District, Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, subject to State taxation, annually, for a period of five years for the purpose of building and giving additional aid to the public schools.

For the purposes of said special election the polling place will be Goldonna Golden's store and the following three commissioners and clerks will serve without compensation: J. C. Row, E. L. Brewton, Sr., W. A. Harris, Dallas Pennington.

At said special election the polls will open at seven o'clock a. m. and close at five o'clock p. m. and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at ten o'clock a. m. on the 4th day of May, 1917, the said Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, will meet at Natchitoches, Louisiana, and in open session proceed to open the ballot box and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns, and declare the results of said special election.

CHARTER

STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF NATCHITOCHE, BEFORE ME, R. A. Hawthorne a Notary Public in and for the State and Parish above written, personally came and appeared the subscribers hereunto, J. F. Mathis, whose post office address is Boyce, La., and V. G. Phillips, whose post office address is Provencal, La., the said V. G. Phillips also representing one, H. A. Lurton, whose post office address is Pensacola, Escambia County, Florida, by power of attorney hereto affixed and made part hereof, who declared unto me that they, the said J. F. Mathis, V. G. Phillips and H. A. Lurton, hereby agree to and do organize a corporation and apply for letters patent incorporating themselves, their associates, successors or assigns in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana and upon and under the following proposed Charter, to-wit:

1. The name of the corporation shall be PROVENCAL TURPENTINE COMPANY, INC., and its principal place of business shall be at Provencal, Natchitoches Parish, La. It shall have the power to establish such other places of business in said state or elsewhere as its Board of Directors or Stockholders may determine.

2. The corporation is organized for a period of ninety-nine, (99) years.

3. The amount of capital stock hereby authorized shall be thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) divided into three hundred (300) shares of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), each payable in cash or property.

4. The objects and purposes of the corporation shall be to own, use, buy, sell, rent, lease, mortgage, manage, operate and improve lands and timber and more especially turpentine orchards, to improve and develop lands for sale, rent, farming or other purposes, to produce, manufacture, buy and sell turpentine and rosin and the by-products thereof, to own, operate and maintain mercantile and commissary business and all the real, personal and live stock or motor driven properties necessary or desirable in the conduct of its business; to own, operate, lease and sell sawmills, tram-roads, steam-boats, barges, or other means of transportation, (except as common carrier) to mortgage or pledge the properties of the corporation, to make use of a common seal and alter the same at pleasure, to appoint such officers, agents and employees as the aforesaid business may require, to fix their compensation and through the Board of Directors, all needful by-laws for the government of the corporation; and generally, to do and perform all acts which may be required, necessary or beneficial in the successful conduct of the business of the said corporation.

5. The business of the corporation shall be conducted by the following officers, viz: a President, a Vice-President and a Secretary-Treasurer, and a Board of Directors consisting of not less than three nor more than nine members, the number to be fixed at any stockholders meeting, but as common carrier, the three members shall constitute a full board. The Directors shall be elected annually by the stockholders at a meeting to be held on the Tuesday after the second Monday in January of each year, and the other officers shall be chosen annually by the Board of Directors at a meeting to be held on the same day after the above stockholders meeting or as soon thereafter as practicable.

6. Other stockholders meetings may be held in accordance with the laws and vacancies among the officers or board of directors shall be filled also according to the laws of the aforesaid State.

7. Until the first annual meeting the officers of this corporation shall be: J. F. MATHIS, Pres. H. A. LURTON, Vice-Pres. V. G. PHILLIPS, Sec.-Treas.

8. The Board of Directors shall consist of the above named officers and the said V. G. Phillips shall act as General Manager.

9. All meetings of stockholders and directors shall be held at the domicile of the corporation and notices of such meetings shall be delivered in person or by registered mail in writing to the last known address of the stockholders.

10. This corporation may amend its charter or liquidate its business at a stockholders meeting upon a two-thirds vote of the stockholders present. Fifteen days written notice of such meeting together with statement of the objects and purposes thereof shall be given in person or by registered mail to all stockholders of the corporation. In case of liquidation, the Board of directors shall appoint a liquidator. Citation and other legal process shall be served on the President of the corporation or in his absence on the next ranking officer.

11. No stockholder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the contracts and faults of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance of the stock for which he has subscribed; nor shall any more informality in organizing this corporation have the effect of rendering this charter null and void in or exposing the stockholders to any liability other than as above provided.

12. Each of the incorporators hereto subscribe to the capital stock for one hundred shares (100) each of par value of one hundred dollars (\$100.00), the aggregate being thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00); the same this date being paid in full by property in equal indivisible by the incorporators, itemized, described and appraised by the Board of Directors and transferred to this Corporation as shown by deeds and acts annexed hereto and made a part of this act of incorporation as provided by law.

13. Certificates of the stock as herein provided in kind and amount shall be issued to the said incorporators. This charter together with the annexed deeds includes the subscription to the capital stock.

14. The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which this corporation may at any time subject itself shall not exceed three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000.00).

That in accordance with petition of the Citizens hereto attached and made a part hereof and the ordinance of this Body passed this day creating Road District No. 23, of the Parish of Natchitoches, a special election is hereby ordered to be held in Road District No. 23 Ward Five in the Parish of Natchitoches on the 19th day of May 1917, at which shall be submitted to the property tax payers of said Road District No. 23 said District and qualified to vote at each election the following proposition:

To levy a special tax of 10 mills for five years, for the construction and maintenance of roads and bridges in said District No. 23, said District embracing and comprising the following territory:

That the Secretary of the Police Jury of the Union Grove and Three Pines School District shall have prepared for use at said election a sufficient number of ballots on each of which shall be printed the proposition mentioned and set forth in section 1 of this ordinance, in the following form to-wit:

"Ballot."

Proposition to levy a Ten Mill Special tax for five years on all the assessable property embraced in Road District No. 23, said District embracing all that territory of Ward 5 known as the Union Grove and Three Pines School District except that portion of Road District No. 2, which might be in said District. Said tax of 10 Mills to exist for 5 years beginning with the year 1917 and ending with and including the year 1921.

3. The Secretary is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said election all the necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, list of voters, assessed valuation on property and completed statements of voters in number and amount.

4. That said special election be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana, and at polling place Ajax in Ward Five of the Parish of Natchitoches, La., and the following are appointed to serve as Commissioners and Clerk of said election, viz: Chester Walker, B. L. Tuer and Jas. Blue Commissioners of Election and B. R. Place, Clerk of said Election.

5. That the President of the Police Jury is hereby instructed to issue his proclamation giving notice of the special election herein ordained and to announce that at the hour of 10 o'clock a. m. Monday, 2nd day of July 1917 this Police Jury will meet at the Court House in the City of Natchitoches, La., and open the ballot boxes and count the ballots in number and amount and declare the result of the election.
