Mystery Solved

The fine Sherlock Holmes work done on the quiet by Sheriff Payne has solved the mystery of Registered Mail Pouch XX 1. For two or three weeks letters of importance containing money or

any response, and for a time it was thought that the mail boxes were being rifled, and it was only after one of the checks aroused suspicion when handed a merchant in Alexandria to be cashed, that he rang up the signer in Natchitoches and the sheriff got on the trail and at once got busy. The man was the colored T. & P. porter at Cypress, Henry Roque, who was at once arrested and brought to Natchitoches, when Mr. Payne took him out to the scene of his crime and far from inflicting the third degree, used opposite methods and by patiently working upon him the right way, gradually got him to the pitch where he confessed to having stolen the pouch and enjoyed cashing some thousand or more in checks and running thru \$190.00 in cash. The lock, key and some charred remains of the pouch were unearthed and some valuables, watches, spectacles, etc., trailed, thereby solving the mystery that was puzzling the officials, who had kept the matter quiet while it was being investigated.

Roque will be turned over to the Federal authorities.

H. C. L. is getting the serious attention of Congress and it is expected that something will result from the vigorous legislation dealing with this important matter and relief given the public. It was reported that some of the surplus army food would be put on sale in Natchitoches Monday, 18th; rather the public would be privileged to order thru the post office officials, but nothing definite could be learned upon inquiry, tho it has been announced that every section of the country would be given the same opportunity and all orders filed with postmasters where there was no local distributing point, would be delivered by parcel post.

The policy of forbearance of the United States towards Mexico, has been strained to the limit and that government now will be spurred to more vigilant and vigorous action to suppress banditry and safeguard the lives and rights of Americans in that country.

CHARTER

State of Louisiana.

Parish of Natchitoches.

Personally same and appeared before me, the undersigned authority, the persons hereunto subscribed, who declared that availing themselves of the laws of this State, they do by these present form a corporation, with the following, as both the charter and original subscription list thereof:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be: "Natchitoches Transfer Co., Inc." Its domicile shall be the city of Natchitoches, La.

It shall exist for a period of fifty years unless sooner dissolved. Shall have authority to sue and be sued. It shall begin business immediately, and own a corporate seal.

Legal processes shall be served upon the president or in his absence upon the secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE II

The object and purpose of the corporation shall be to own and operate a regular transfer and delivery business; to own, buy and sell real estate; to own, buy and sell automobiles, wagons, buggies, horses; to own, buy and sell all kinds of vehicles and automobiles, trucks and tractors, and to hypothecate, mortgage or sell same and to do and perform all other things and matters incident and necessary to the operation of a general transfer business.

ARTICLE III

Its capital stock is fixed at Five Thousand Dollars, with the right to increase the capital stock to the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars as a maximum capital. Stock subscriptions shall be payable within TEN days from date of subscription.

ARTICLE IV

Its affairs shall be managed by, and its corporate powers vested in a Board of Directors, consisting of three members to be elected by the stockholders at a meeting to be held on the 3rd Monday in July of each year, beginning in 1920.

At an election for Directors each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote.

The Board of Directors shall have power to employ a general manager or such other employees as may be necessary to successfully operate the business; fix their compensation and duties, etc., who shall, at all times, be

amenable to the will of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V

No stockholder shall ever be held liable or responsible for the faults or contracts of this corporation in any further sum than the unpaid balance of the stock subscribed for; nor shall any merely informality in organization have the effect of rendering this charter null or exposing a stockholder to any liability other than above provided.

The first Board of directors shall be composed of Morris Aaron, who is elected president; D. W. Breazeale, who is elected vice-president, and J. B. Pressburg, who is elected secretary-treasurer, all of Natchitoches, La., and they shall hold office until their successors are elected.
