ORDINANCE CREATING ROAD DISTRICT NO. 29, OF THE PARISH OF NATCHITOCHES, STATE OF LOUISIANA.
By Mr. Salter, seconded by Mr. Sanders:
Be it enacted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, in legal session convened, all members of the said Police Jury being present and voting on the questions involved.
Section 1. Be it enacted, by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, that acting under the authority of Articles 292 and 281 of the Constitution, and the laws passed carrying the said articles into effect, and especially under and by virtue of the authority conferred by Acts 266 of 1910, and Act 30 of 1917, extra session and other laws on the same subject matter.
That all of that part of Ward Nine of the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana, not embraced in Road District No. 11, 12 and 13 of the Parish of Natchitoches, be and the same is hereby created Road District No. 29, of the Parish of Natchitoches.
Section 2. Be it further ordained, that the ordinance creating the said Road District No. 29, of the Parish of Natchitoches, shall be published in the official Journal of the Parish of Natchitoches, for ten clear days, to appear in three separate editions of the said official Journal, as required by law. That within the time allowed by law, any objection to the creation of the said road district shall be filed with the Clerk and Secretary of the Police Jury.
Section 3. Be it further enacted, that the Police Jury shall meet on the 25th day of August 1919, at the hour of 10 a. m., then and there to take action in the matters of calling a special election by the duly qualified electors, within the territorial limits of the said Road District No. 29, of the Parish of Natchitoches, in accordance with the provisions of the acts above set forth, to take the sense of the tax payers and duly qualified electors as to the wisdom and propriety of voting taxes and issuing bonds therefor, in an amount not exceeding One Hundred thousand Dollars, for the purpose of constructing roads and bridges, and maintaining same, after construction, bonds to bear interest at a rate of interest not exceeding five per cent, and to be sold for not less than par and to run for a period of time not greater than forty years, as provided by law, in accordance with the Constitutional provisions and the acts of Legislatures of the State.
Carried unanimously.

AN ORDINANCE

Calling a special election of all persons entitled to vote at a special election to be held in Road Dist. No. 26.
By Mr. Joyner, seconded by Mr. Tauzin:

Sec. I. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE POLICE JURY OF THE PARISH OF NATCHITOCHES, LOUISIANA.

That a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in Road Dist. No. 26 at the following polling places in said District to-wit:

Precinct No. 1, Ashland
Precinct No. 2, Chestnut
Precinct No. 3, Goldonna

All in ward two of Natchitoches Parish La. That said special election shall be held on the 16th day of September 1919, at which shall be submitted the proposition to-wit:

To incur debt and to issue bonds to the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$200,000.00) to run for a period of Twenty years (20) to-wit: 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922, 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926, 1927, 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937, and 1938, to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum.

All interest payable annually for the purpose of constructing and maintaining gravel and dirt roads in said Road Dist. No. 26.

Sec. II. That the Secretary of the Police Jury be and she is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election, a sufficient number of ballots on which shall be printed the proposition embraced in Section 1, of this ordinance, substantially in the following form:

Special election in Road District No. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, on the 16th day of August A. D. 1919.

Proposition to incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, to run for twenty years from date, and to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum payable annually for the purpose of constructing and maintaining gravel and dirt roads within said District.

All in conformity to an ordinance creating Road District No. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches, adopted by Police Jury on the 8th day of July 1919.

Sec. III. That the Secretary of the Police Jury is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election all the necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, list of voters, assessed valuation of property and compiled statement of voters in number and amount.

The following Commissioners are hereby appointed for precinct No. 1, Ashland-Tom McCallis, W. W. Riggs, Joe Smith, Clerk of said election, M. R. Loy.

For precinct No. 2, Chestnut-C. J. Fallon, W. G. Walker, W. W. Weaver, Clerk of said election, R. E. Dobson.

For precinct No. 3, Goldonna-W. A. Golden, R. F. Quarles, G. M. Coleman, Clerk of said election, Curley Bryant.

Sec. IV. That the President of the Police Jury is hereby instructed to

give notice of the said special election by his proclamation published in the official Journal according to law, and in said proclamation he shall announce that at 10 o'clock a. m., on the 18th day of September 1919 the Police Jury will meet at its regular meeting place in the City of Natchitoches Louisiana and shall there and then proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and canvass the returns and declare and promulgate the result of said election as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE

Calling a special election of all persons entitled to vote at a special election to be held in Road District No. 27.

Sec. I. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

That a special election be and the same is hereby ordered to be held in Road District No. 27 at the following polling places in said District, to-wit: Precinct No. 1, Cloutierville, Precinct No. 2, Chopin, Precinct No. 3, Marco.

All situated in Ward Ten and District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

That said special election shall be held on the 16th day of September 1919, at which shall be submitted the proposition to incur debt and issue bonds to the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$200,000.00) to run for twenty years, to-wit: 1920, 1921, 1922, 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926, 1927, 1928, 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1936, 1937, 1938 and 1939, to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent per annum.

All interest payable annually for the purpose of constructing and maintaining gravel and other roads within said District as follows: Commencing at a point on Bayou Derbanne approximately three miles west of Derry station, thence east to Derry station, thence across Cane River, thence along East bank of Cane River to Cloutierville; thence along East bank of Cane River to Chopin bridge, thence along East bank of Cane River to the mouth of Cane River opposite Colfax; with lateral roads as follows: From Chopin bridge to Chopin station, thence in a westerly direction to bridge across Mill Bayou.

Also to construct bridge across Cane River at a point between Marco post office and the mouth of Cane River and lateral.

Sec. IV. That said special election shall be conducted under the laws of the State of Louisiana, applicable thereto.

Sec. V. That the President of the Police Jury is hereby instructed to give notice of the said special election by his proclamation published in the official Journal according to law, and in said proclamation he shall announce that at 10 o'clock a. m., on the 18th day of September 1919, the Police Jury will meet at its regular meeting place in the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana, and shall there and then proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and canvass the returns and declare and promulgate the result of said election as required by law.
