## Proceedings Police Jury

At the meeting held on Monday 15th day of September 1919.

Ordinance ordering a Special Election to be held in Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

The following ordinance was offered by Mr. Charleville, seconded by Mr. Furlow:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, that a special election be and is hereby called and ordered to be held in said Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches on Tuesday, the twenty-first day of the month of October 1919, between the hours of seven (7) o'clock a. m., and five (5) o'clock p. m., and that at said special election there shall be submitted to the taxpayers resident citizens of said Road District qualified under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said special election a proposition to authorize the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches to incur debt on behalf of and in the name of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) and to issue and sell serial negotiable semi-annual interest bearing coupon bonds evidencing the said indebtedness being less than ten per centum (10%) of the assessed valuation of the property in said Road District; said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five per centum (5%) per annum, payable semi-annually, the principal and interest of said bonds to be payable in such amounts and at such times and places as the governing authority may determine, said bonds to run twenty (20) years from the date thereof, and both the principal and interest of said bonds to be secured by a sufficient tax to be levied and collected each year in accordance with Article 231 of the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Louisiana, the proceeds from the sale of said bonds at not less than par to be used in constructing, improving and maintaining the public roads and highways within Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

Be it further ordained, That the President of the Police Jury be and is hereby authorized and directed to have the necessary ballots printed for the said election, which ballots shall contain the foregoing proposition and be drawn up in accordance with law and the provisions of this ordinance; and he is also authorized to arrange for providing the ballot boxes, the necessary blanks for tally sheets and compiled statements.

Be it further ordained, That the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Registrar of Voters shall furnish to the election officers hereinafter named for said special election with a list of the taxpayers in said Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches entitled to vote in person or by proxy at the said special election as shown by the assessment roll last made and filed prior to said special election.

Be it further ordained, That the following polling places, all within Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, are hereby designated and determined upon as the polling places to hold the said special election, and the following named persons are hereby instructed and empowered to act as officers of the said special election, viz:

Precinct No. 1 at Cloutierville, La.,—R. T. Delouche, E. N. Masson, J. P. Guillot, Commissioners; N. Delouche, Clerk.

Be it further ordained, That there shall be published in the official journal of the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches for thirty (30) days a notice of the said special election, said notice to embrace substantially all things above set forth and also notice that the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, as the governing authority of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, will meet in open session at the Court House at Natchitoches, Louisiana, at ten (10) o'clock a. m., on Wednesday, the twenty-second day of the month of October 1919, and then and there proceed to open the ballot boxes used in said special election, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of the said election.

Be it further ordained, That the President of the Police Jury be and is hereby authorized and directed to have the necessary ballots printed for the said election, which ballots shall contain the foregoing proposition and be drawn up in accordance with law and the provisions of this ordinance; and he is also authorized to arrange for providing the ballot boxes, the necessary blanks for tally sheets and compiled statements.

Be it further ordained, That the Clerk of Court and Ex-Officio Registrar of Voters shall furnish to the election officers hereinafter named for said special election with a list of the taxpayers in said Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches entitled to vote in person or by proxy at the said special election as shown by the assessment roll last made and filed prior to said special election.

Be it further ordained, That the following polling places, all within Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, are hereby designated and determined upon as the polling places to hold the said special election, and the following named persons are hereby instructed and empowered to act as officers of the said special election, viz:

Precinct No. 1 at Cloutierville, La.,—R. T. Delouche, E. N. Masson, J. P. Guillot, Commissioners; N. Delouche, Clerk.  
Precinct No. 2, at Chopin, La.—

Charles Salard, Lee Sharp, J. M. Johnson, Commissioners; Adrian Rachal, Clerk.

Precinct No. 3, at Marco, La.—E. DeLaerda, Q. A. Hargis, John Abraham, Commissioners; Frank Dean, Clerk.

The officers of election above named shall hold the said election to conform with Act 256 of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana as amended, and shall make due returns of the said election for the meeting of the Police Jury to be held on Wednesday, the twenty-second day of the month of October 1919, and the said officers of election shall be compensated in accordance with law by the Police Jury.

The ordinance being submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows: Yeas: Tauzin, Joyner, Hart, Raphael, Furlow, Page, Ford, Salter, Charleville. Nays: None.

And the ordinance was declared adopted.

## ORDINANCE CREATING ROAD DISTRICT NO. 29 OF THE PARISH OF NATCHITOCHEs.

The following ordinance was offered by Mr. Salter, seconded by Mr. Tauzin: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, that a Road District be and is hereby created under the terms and conditions of Act 30 of the Extra Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1917, to comprise all of the territory within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, that said Road District be known as Road District No. 29 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

Be it further ordained, That the boundaries of said Road District No. 29 of the Parish of Natchitoches shall be the following: All of the territory of Ward 9 west of Cane River not included in Road Districts Nos. 12 and 13 of said Parish of Natchitoches, La. Said District No. 29 being bounded on the east by Cane River Lake, on the south by Wards 10 and 7, west by Road District No. 13 of said Parish and on the north by Road District No. 13 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana. All within the Parish of Natchitoches, State of Louisiana.

Be it further ordained, That the said Road District No. 29 of the Parish of Natchitoches as thus created shall constitute a corporation in law to conform with the terms and conditions of Act 30 of the Extra Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1917.

The ordinance being submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows: Yeas: Tauzin, Joyner, Hart, Raphael, Furlow, Page, Ford, Salter, Charleville. Nays: None.

And the ordinance was declared adopted.

## ORDINANCE CREATING ROAD DISTRICT NO. 26 OF THE PARISH OF NATCHITOCHEs.

The following ordinance was offered by Dr. Joyner, seconded by Mr. Salter: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, that a road district be and is hereby created under the terms and conditions of Act 30 of the Extra Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1917, to comprise all of the territory within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, that said Road District be known as Road District No. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches.

Be it further ordained, That the boundaries of said Road District No. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches shall be the following: All of the territory embraced in Ward 2, Parish of Natchitoches, said district being bounded on the north by Bienville Parish, west and south by Black Lake and east by Saine Bayou.

Be it further ordained, That the said Road District No. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches as thus created shall constitute a corporation in law to conform with the terms and conditions of Act 30 of the Extra Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1917.

The ordinance being submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows: Yeas: Tauzin, Joyner, Hart, Raphael, Furlow, Page, Ford, Salter, Charleville. Nays: None.

And the ordinance was declared adopted.

Ordinance creating Road District No. 30 of the Parish of Natchitoches.

The following ordinance was offered by Mr. Joyner, seconded by Mr. Furlow:

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, La., That a Road District be and is hereby created under the terms and conditions of Act No. 30 of the Extra Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1917, to comprise all of the territory within the boundaries hereinafter set forth, that said Road District be known as "Road District No. 30 of the Parish of Natchitoches."

Be it further ordained, That the boundaries of said Road District No. 30 of the Parish of Natchitoches shall be the following: All of the territory on the East Bank of Cane River in Ward 9 of the Parish of Natchitoches Louisiana.

Be it further ordained, That the said Road District No. 30 of the Parish of Natchitoches as thus created shall constitute a corporation in law to conform with the terms and conditions of Act 30 of the Extra Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana for the year 1917.

The ordinance being submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows: Yeas: Tauzin, Joyner, Hart, Raphael, Furlow, Page, Ford, Salter and Charleville. Nays: None.

And the ordinance was declared adopted.

By Mr. Furlow, seconded by Mr. Tauzin: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, La., That an election is hereby ordered to be held in Road District No. 28, Ward 5, as created by ordinance of date July 8th 1919, said election to be held on the 21st day of October 1919, at which shall be submitted to the property tax payers qualified to vote at such election the following proposition:

To levy a special five mill tax on the dollar upon all the assessable property situated in Road District No. 28 of Ward 5 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, for a period of five years beginning with the year 1920 and ending with and including the year 1924. Said tax to be devoted to the constructing and maintenance of roads in said Road District No. 28 of Ward 5.

Section 2. That the Secretary of the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election a sufficient number of ballots on the following form:

BALLOT  
Proposition to levy a five mill special tax on the dollar on all assessable property in Road District No. 28 of Ward 5 of the Parish of Natchitoches, for a period of five years beginning with the year 1920 and ending with and including the year 1924. Said tax to be devoted to the constructing and maintenance of roads in said Road District No. 28 of Ward 5, Louisiana.

Notice to Voters:—To vote in favor of said proposition place a cross (X) mark in the square below the word "YES". To vote against said proposition place a similar mark in the square below the word "NO".

Section 3. That the Secretary is hereby instructed to have prepared for use at said special election all necessary ballot boxes, tally sheets, lists of voters assessed valuation of property and compiled statement of voters in number and amount.

Section IV. That said special election shall be held in accordance with the laws of the State of Louisiana and at the following precincts, and the following are appointed Commissioners and Clerks of said election:

Precinct Beulah, Ward 5—C. C. McCartney, A. C. Knott, J. H. Cook, Commissioners and Frank James, Clerk of said election.

Precinct Marthville, Ward 5—B. T. Look, Julian Dixon and Iherman Pullin, Commissioners, and Bill Glass, Clerk of said election.

Section V. That the President of the Police Jury, Parish of Natchitoches, La., shall give notice of said special election herein ordered and in said proclamation he shall announce that the hour of ten o'clock a. m., on the 22nd day of Oct. 1919 the said Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches shall meet at its regular meeting place in the City of Natchitoches and in open session open the ballot boxes, count the ballots in both number and amount and declare the result of the election.

The vote being taken resulted as follows: Yeas: Tauzin, Joyner, Hart, Raphael, Furlow, Page, Ford, Salter and Charleville. Nays: None.

(Carried unanimously.)

By Mr. Salter, seconded by Mr. Page: Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, that the ordinance passed this day creating Road District No. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Road District No. 29 of the Parish of Natchitoches and Road District No. 30 of the Parish of Natchitoches shall be published in the official Journal of the Parish of Natchitoches, La., for Ten (10) days and any objections to the creating of either of these Road Districts shall be filed with the Clerk of the Police Jury within (10) days as provided for by Act 30 of the Special Session of the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, 1917.

Be it further ordained that the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches shall meet in regular session at its regular meeting place at the Court House in the City of Natchitoches, on Monday, October 6th, at 10 o'clock a. m., and will act on any protest or protests filed against the creation, and also for the purpose of calling elections and transaction of any other business pertaining to the issuance of bonds by Road Districts Nos. 26 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Road District No. 29 of the Parish of Natchitoches, and Road District No. 30 of the Parish of Natchitoches.

(Carried unanimously.) Moved and seconded the Hon. Police Jury adjourned until next regular meeting October 6th, 1919.

## NOTICE OF ELECTION

Pursuant to an ordinance adopted by the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, acting as the governing authority of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, at a meeting of said Police Jury held on Monday, the fifteenth day of the month of September 1919, I, James F. Salter, President of the said Police Jury, hereby give notice that, in compliance with said ordinance, a special election will be held in Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches on Tuesday, the twenty-first day of the month of October 1919 for the purpose of taking the sense of the property taxpayers resident citizens qualified under the Constitution and Laws of the State of Louisiana to vote at said election as to whether or not they will authorize the Police Jury of the Parish of Natchitoches, as the governing authority of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, to incur debt on behalf of and in the name of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches in the amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars, (\$200,000.00) and to issue and sell serial negotiable semi-annual interest bearing coupon bonds evidencing the said indebtedness; said bonds to bear interest at the rate of five per centum (5 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually, the principal and interest of said bonds to be payable in such amounts and at such times and places as the governing authority may determine, said bonds to run twenty (20) years from the date thereof, and both the principal and interest of said bonds to be secured by a sufficient tax to be levied and collected each year in accordance with Article 231 of the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Louisiana, the proceeds from the sale of said bonds at not less than par to be used in constructing, improving and maintaining the public roads and highways within Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

The polling places will be as follows: Precinct No. 1, at Cloutierville, La. Precinct No. 2, at Chopin, La. Precinct No. 3, at Marco, La.

At said election the polls will open at seven (7) o'clock a. m., and will close at five (5) o'clock p. m., according to law.

Notice is also given that at ten o'clock a. m., on Wednesday, the twenty-second day of the month of October 1919 the Police Jury as the governing authority of Road District No. 27 of the Parish of Natchitoches will meet at Natchitoches Louisiana, at the Court House in said City, and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes used in said election, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the results of said special election.
