JAPAN'S CHILD LABOR WORKS A 16-HOUR DAY



Third of Nations Two Million Operatives are Women and Girls—Discontent is Growing Among Them.

Cherry blossoms and snow-capped mountains mean little to these laborers of picturesque Japan. For sixteen hours a day they stand at their machines, with only one or two rest days a month. Their homes are factory dormitories, and after two years many of them contract tuberculosis or other diseases which compel them to give up work. Six hundred thousand of Japan's 2,000,000 operatives are women and girls, and some 300,000 are from ten to eighteen years of age. This is one of the reasons why the Interchurch World Movement has mapped an educational program which, during the next five years, will help the Japanese government solve some of its problems. The cost of living in Tokyo is greater than in New York or London. There are frequent strikes, and increased suffering and discontent mark the industrial world. Working hours are excessive. The Protestant churches which are cooperating in the new world run believe that one way of working for the children is to enlarge church educational programs. A part of this project, too great for single denomination, is the establishment of a Japanese Christian society.

SECTION 7. Be it further ordained that the city commission of the city of Natchitoches, Louisiana, obligate themselves and are bound under the terms and conditions of law and the election authorizing the bonds, to levy such taxes on all property in the city of Natchitoches, Louisiana, as may be sufficient to provide for the principal and interest on said bonds as the same respectively become due and payable, such taxes not to exceed the limit as fixed by the constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana and such tax shall be annually levied upon all the taxable property in said city at the same time and in the same manner as other taxes in said city are levied and collected.

Proceedings of Special Meeting

Proceedings of a special meeting of the Mayor and City Commission of the City of Natchitoches, parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, held on the 31 day of May, 1920, at their regular meeting place in said city.

Present: May. Com. W. F. Johnson and Commissioners Suddath and Himel. Absent: None.

On motion of Com. Himel, seconded by Com. Suddath, the following ordinance was duly adopted:

An ordinance authorizing the issuance of \$240,000 of Public Improvement Bonds of the City of Natchitoches, Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, prescribing the form thereof, providing for the levy of taxes for the payment of the principal and interest thereon and repealing and rescinding an ordinance heretofore adopted on the 23rd day of February, 1920, and all ordinances in conflict therewith.

Whereas an ordinance was heretofore adopted on the 23rd day of February, 1920, providing for the issuance of \$240,000 of Public Improvement Bonds of the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana, and Whereas it is desired to make certain changes in the form and maturities of said bonds and to prescribe a place of payment for the same.

Now therefore,

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and City Commission of the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana, pursuant to the terms of Article 281 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana, and Act 256 of the General Assembly of said State for the year 1910 as amended and the said Mayor and City Commission having been duly authorized at an election held in said city on the 27th day of January, 1920, hereby authorizes the incurring of an indebtedness of \$240,000 on behalf of said City of Natchitoches, for the purpose of providing funds for purchasing and constructing systems of water works and a sewerage system and to represent said indebtedness, hereby authorizes the issuance of \$240,000 of Public Improvement Bonds of the City of Natchitoches, La. numbered from 1 to 240 inclusive, of the denomination of \$1,000 each, dated April 1, 1920, bearing interest at the rate of five per centum per annum, from date until actually paid, said interest being payable semi-annually on the first days of April and October in each year, and each of said bonds having attached thereto coupons or represent the said interest.

SECTION 2. Be it further ordained that the said bonds and interest thereon shall be payable at the Chase National Bank of New York, N. Y.

SECTION 3. Be it further ordained that the said bonds shall be substantially the following form:


