### School Board Proceedings.

The Natchitoches Parish School Board met in regular session on Tuesday the 5th day of April, 1921, the following members present:

Messrs: Z. T. Gallion, Jr., E. T. Walker, A. L. Messick, C. C. Hattaway, G. L. Berry, T. B. Sellers, J. S. Rachal, Sam'l Friedman, M. Barron.

There was absent Mr. J. F. Hawthorn.

Resolution by Mr. Hattaway and seconded by Mr. Friedman:

That the bonds for school district Six (6) be prepared immediately and advertised for sale.

Resolution by Mr. Gallion and seconded by Mr. Hattaway:

That Supt. Hooper, Mr. Friedman and Mr. Weaver be appointed a committee of three to consult an architect in regard to building a school building in District Number Six (6).

Resolution by Mr. Berry and seconded by Mr. Hattaway:

That the Superintendent be authorized to advertise for bids to build a school building in District Number Six (6).

Resolution by Mr. Messick and seconded by Mr. Barron:

That Supt. Hooper be authorized to sell Lots 14, 15 and 16 of Block 16 in the town of Pownatan to Judge Cunningham and to sell to him the lot between Ex-Supt. Hudson and W. T. Cunningham, for the price and sum of \$150, of which \$50 has already been paid.

Resolution by Mr. Gallion and seconded by Mr. Berry:

That the matter of selling two lots to Mitchell Gustaf and Powhatan be referred to Mr. A. L. Messick, Board member of ward three and Supt. Hooper.

Resolution by Mr. Friedman and seconded by Mr. Gallion:

That Supt. Hooper and Mr. Hawthorn fix the boundaries of the Bellwood School District so that an election can be called at the next meeting of the Board.

Resolution by Mr. Hattaway and seconded by Mr. Gallion:

That Supt. Hooper and Mr. Gallion be authorized to investigate the special taxes for building and report to the Board at its next meeting.

Resolution by Mr. Gallion and seconded by Mr. Friedman:

That School District Number One (1) Bonds be advertised for sale.

Resolution by Mr. Gallion and seconded by Mr. Hattaway:

That Supt. Hooper be authorized to ask for bids on construction of the Natchitoches High School Building in school district number 9. (Carried)

Resolution by Mr. Hattaway and seconded by Mr. Gallion:

That Supt. Hooper be authorized to ask for bids on construction of the Campiti High School Building in School District Number One (1). (Carried)

Proceedings of the Natchitoches Parish School Board at the regular meeting of said board held at the City of Natchitoches, Louisiana, on

the fifth day of April, A. D., 1921. School Board of School District Number Nine (9) of the Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana.

Be it ordained by the Natchitoches Parish School Board, acting as the governing authority of School District Number Nine (9) of the Parish of Natchitoches, that the Assessor and Tax Collector of the Parish of Natchitoches are hereby instructed and ordered to assess and collect for the year 1921 a tax of five (5) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the taxable property situated in School District Number Nine (9) of the Parish of Natchitoches, for the purpose of providing for the payment of the interest falling due October 1, 1921, and the interest on the fractional part of the principal falling due April 1, 1922, of an issue of One Hundred and Sixty Thousand (\$160,000.00) Dollars of School District Bonds of School District Number Nine (9) of the Parish of Natchitoches, and that a copy of this ordinance be forwarded to both the Assessor and the Tax Collector of the Parish of Natchitoches.

This ordinance having been submitted to a vote, the vote thereon was as follows:

Yeas: Messrs. Gallion, Walker, Messick, Hattaway, Berry, Sellers, J. S. Rachal, Friedman, Barron.
