Special Meeting Parish of Natchitoches, Louisiana, Tuesday, May 24, 1921

The Hon. Police Jury met in special session at 10 o'clock adjournment May 7th, 1921, with President Airey presiding and all members present except Mr. Copellar and Mr. Phillips.

Being the time set for the opening of bids for the sale of the Bonds of Road District No. 19 and bonds of Road District No. 27, ward 10, the secretary read the advertisement inviting bids for the said sales, and then announced that the following bids were on file:

For the bonds of Road District No. 19—One bid; That of W. L. Slayton, Toledo, Ohio.

By Mr. Page seconded by Mr. Airey: RESOLUTION
Whereas, the closing of Bayou Winicie, which runs out of Red River into Bayou Pierre, is of very great importance to the Parish of Natchitoches, due to the fact that its closing will render much less subject to overflow thousands of acres of the best tillable lands in the parish.

Whereas, the Parish of Red River has set aside the sum of Four Thousand Dollars to be used for this purpose.

Whereas, the Parish of Natchitoches is asked to set aside the same sum so set aside and appropriated by the Parish of Red River.

Resolved, that a sufficient sum to be derived from the regular taxes to be annually assessed and collected, is hereby set aside and appropriated out of the general fund of Natchitoches Parish.

Resolved, that in as much as the Exchange Bank and Merchants and Farmers Bank have agreed to advance to the Police Jury its proportion of the said four thousand dollars to be used for said purpose, that the other two Fiscal Banks are hereby asked to do likewise.

On the vote being taken, there was voting for the resolution the following: Mr. Sandlin, Dr. Joyner, Mr. Airey, Mr. Knott, Mr. Page, Mr. Dowden, Mr. Friedman and Mr. Lacaze.

Against the resolution, the following: None.
(Carried unanimously.)

By Mr. Knott, seconded by Mr. Page: That Mr. Merrell be nominated on Health Work for Natchitoches Parish Unit if it's within jurisdiction of the Police Jury.
(Carried.)

By Mr. Dowden, seconded by Mr. Airey:
That Mr. Furlow complete the contemplated road work in Ward 5, and that he wait until money is available for the payment of same.
(Carried.)

By Mr. Lacaze, seconded by Mr. Dowden:
That in accordance with petition of Citizens of Ward 4, that a public road be established as follows:
Running as near the Ward line of Three and Four, beginning at John Boyd to the Fulton place, thence to a bar, thence to connect with the public road from Campti to Coushatta at Mrs. Collier's Place. Tracers appointed: J. O. Boyd, D. J. Barr, Harrell Collier, A. W. Barksdale, and Charley Smith.
(Carried unanimously.)

By Mr. Dowden, seconded by Mr. Airey:
That the report from Ward 8 of Tracers be tabled until July meeting.
(Carried.)

By Mr. Lacaze, seconded by Mr. Airey:
That Ambrose Gallion and Corinne Meehan be placed on the allowance list of the parish.

Moved and seconded, the Hon. Police Jury adjourned for further consideration of bids, to meet on June 4th for final decision, and for any other immediate business which might come before the Police Jury.
